- In the matter of "Child Care Access Means Parent in School," a CCAMPIS grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Education to San Diego Mesa College, authorization is requested to:
- 1. Enter into a one-year agreement with the U.S. Department of Education for the period of October 1, 2009, to September 30, 2010, in the amount of \$59,409; and
- 2. Accept, budget and spend for the period of October 1, 2009, to September 30, 2010, in the Child Development Fund at San Diego Mesa College \$59,409 from the U.S. Department of Education.
