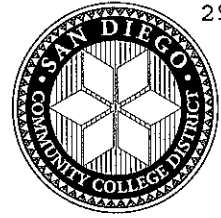

Tom Eggleston - Risk Manager, Human Resources RE: Closed Session Item 101.2.a.

Chancellor Carroll stated that Mr. Eggleston requested this matter be heard in public and that the normal practice would be followed: Acting Vice Chancellor of Human Resources, Will Surbrook, would provide a brief summary of the issue, followed by Mr. Eggleston's comments to the Board for up to 15 min, at which time the Board could ask clarifying questions.

Acting Vice Chancellor Will Surbrook summarized the issue before the Board - the recommendation of the termination of the employment of Tom Eggleston, Risk Manager, effective April 4, 2011, on the following grounds: incompetence and inefficiency in the performance of assigned duties; failure to follow reasonable directions by the immediate supervisor; hindering the normal operation of the office because of negligent duty; acts deemed negligent or unnecessary and in conflict with the furtherance of organizational goals and objectives.

Mr. Eggleston addressed the Board stating the reasons why he believes the allegations do not warrant termination. He stated he has been the sole Risk Management person for 6000 employees for 8 years and believes it is too big a job for one person in such a large organization; he has worked diligently, honestly, and completely, saved the District tens of thousands in costs and protected the district from claims and lawsuits; and he has had good evaluations for 11 years.



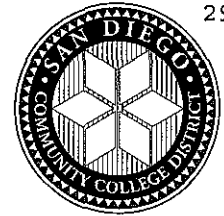

Chancellor Constance Carroll

Chancellor Carroll reported on recent discussions in Sacramento regarding the 2011-12 state budget. Efforts are being made to find 4 more votes to achieve the two-thirds level required for legislative action to extend existing taxes before the July 1 expiration date. In the meantime, it is anticipated that the Governor's May Revise budget proposal, which will be delivered on May 16, will be based on the "all-cuts," worst-case model. If tax extensions are approved, the final budget reductions will be contained at the present level. Chancellor Carroll indicated that advocacy efforts were now beginning in all segments of higher education.

Within the SDCCD, plans are in place for budget reductions and 5 Chancellor's Budget Forums were conducted throughout the District in order to share information and solicit input.

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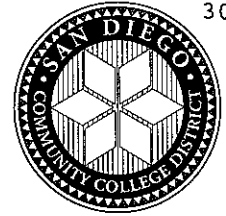

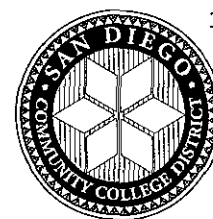

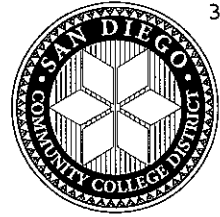
