President San Diego Mesa College



Dr. Ashanti Hands is President of San Diego Mesa College. She is an equity-minded practitioner with a deep commitment to student success. She provides leadership for the college-wide initiative to become the leading college of equity and excellence and has launched Student Equity, Guided Pathways, San Diego Promise (free college), basic needs programs and a Call to Action, shining light on structural racism and our responsibility to ensure that Black students have access to equitable outcomes and opportunities to succeed. She was selected to serve as President of San Diego Mesa College in July 2022. Mesa College serves 25,000 students per year and is one of the largest colleges in California, offering 200 associate degree and certificate programs as well as a four-year baccalaureate degree. Hands' involvement in nonprofit and association work includes San Diego Youth Services, San Diego Mesa Foundation and UCSD Black Alumni Scholarship Fund Board.
