* **385 Law Enforcement Specialist/Master at Arms 10 hours lecture, 1 hour lab, 11.5 units

Prerequisite: Cosmetology 60 and 60L, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.

This course is continued laboratory practice for advanced cosmetology students who need to complete 1600 hours mandated for examination and for licensure by the California State Board of Cosmetology. Emphasis is placed on client services (including chemical and non-chemical services) and an understanding of all types of hair texture. This course teaches communication skills as related to client services and professionalism and is intended to support students in their employment goals. This course may be repeated in combination with Cosmetology 220 for a total of three times. Associate Degree Credit.

* **121 Ethnic Costume: History and Design

1 hour, 1 unit effectiv Grade Only

Advisory: Fashion 120 and 171, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. In *Ethnic Costume: History and Design*, students study world costume, its history and evolution. Students learn how costume is influenced by a country's geography, history and culture. Included in the course is a study of costume silhouette, design, construction and embellishment. Traditional and online research and garment design by computer are incorporated into the course. This course is appropriate for fashion design majors and any student interested in ethnic costume. 177 Improvisation Offered at City and Mesa. 2-3 hours lab, 0.5 - 1 unit Deactivate at City effective **Grade Only Advisory: Completion of Physical Education 110 or 135 or 140 with a grade of "C" 024. Approved or better, or equivalent. This course is designed to give students the opportunity to learn beginning and intermediate improvisational dance skills through the use of space, time, dynamics, and motion of body parts. Emphasis is placed on performance ability and technique. The student is involved in a structured dance performance in various situations and progresses to spontaneous movement in group and individual works. This course may be taken a total of four times for credit. Transfer Credit: CSU and/or private coll/univ.; UC. **RADIO AND TELEVISION (RTVC)** * **125 Television Series and Specials Production Offered at City. 2 hours lecture, 3 hours lab, 3 units **Grade Only** Deactivate at City effective Prerequisite: Radio and Television 122 with a grade of "C" or better, or 021. Approved equivalent. This course involves the development and production of television series and specials through projects in the producing and directing of television programs in conjunction with local television stations and cable systems. 3-9 hours lab, 1-3 units *Prerequisite*: Speech 103 and 160, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent, including high school and/or collegiate debate experience. This course is for the student who is interested in intercollegiate forensics (speech and debate) competition. Special emphasis is given to the preparation of platform speeches (informative, persuasive and after-dinner) and novice intercollegiate debate. Students taking the course for one unit participate in one event and one tournament; for two units, two events and two tournaments; for three units, three events and three tournaments. (FT) Transfer Credit: CSU and/or private coll/ univ.

* ** 117B Intercollegiate Forensics

3-9 hours lab, 1-3 units Prerequisite: SPEE 117A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is for the student who is interested in intercollegiate forensics (speech and debate) competition. Special emphasis is given to the preparation of oral interpretation events (poetry, prose and drama) and intercollegiate debate. Students taking the course for 1 unit participate in one event and one tournament; for two units, two events and two tournaments; for three units, three events and three tournaments. (FT) Transfer Credit: CSU and/or private coll/ univ.

* ** 117C Intercollegiate Forensics

3-9 hours lab, 1-3 units Prerequisite: SPEE 117B with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is for the student who is interested in intercollegiate forensics (speech and debate) competition. Special emphasis is given to limited preparation speech events (impromptu and extemporaneous) and debate. Students taking the course for one unit participate in one event and one tournament; for two units, two events and two tournaments; for three units, three events and three tournaments.

* **117D Intercollegiate Forensics

3-9 hours lab, 1-3 units

Prerequisite: Speech 117C with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is for the student who is interested in intercollegiate forensics (speech and debate) competition. Special emphasis is given to the preparation of five (pentathlon) speech events, debate and team leadership. Students taking the course for one unit participate in one event and one tournament; for two units, two events and two tournaments; for three units, at least three events and three tournaments.
