<p><b>~150 Introduction to Deaf Culture</b></p> <p align="right"><b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b>  <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5.  <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for American Sign Language 104.                      This course is an introduction to the unique aspects of Deaf Culture and Deaf community. Emphasis is placed on in-depth discussion of the beliefs and customs of this sociolinguistic/cultural minority in relation to language use and history of Deaf people in the United States of America. This course is a study of the audiological, educational, social, and communicative aspects of people who are deaf and hearing impaired. Emphasis is placed on historical perspectives and current trends, philosophies, and ideologies related to deafness. 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<p><b>*~ 214 American Sign Language Fingerspelled Signs</b>  <b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units</b>  <b>Grade Only</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b>  <i>Advisory: Completion of or concurrent enrollment in American Sign Language/Interpreting 116 and American Sign Language/Interpreting 116L with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.</i>  This course is an intermediate-advanced study of American Sign Language Fingerspelled Signs and Numbering systems. Emphasis is placed on Native Fingerspelled Signs. Students participate in extensive drills expressively and receptively. <p><b>215 American Sign Language Level III</b>  <b>64 - 72 hours lecture, 4 units</b>  <b>Grade Only</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b>  <i>Prerequisite:</i> American Sign Language/Interpreting 116 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.  <i>Corequisite:</i> American Sign Language/Interpreting 215L.  <i>Corequisite:</i> Completion of or concurrent enrollment in: American Sign Language/Interpreting 214 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent  <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for American Sign Language 200.  This third course in American Sign Language (ASL) is designed to enhance students' receptive and expressive skills at an advanced intermediate level. Emphasis is placed on the ASL syntax, facial grammar, vocabulary, and fingerspelling skills that enable students to participate in increasingly more complex conversations with Deaf community members. Instruction utilizes a natural approach to teaching a second language by engaging students in authentic conversations within the classroom environment. Conversational content seeks to develop student knowledge and understanding of the Deaf community and its art and history. <p><b>~56 Administrative Medical Assisting I</b> <b>16 - 18 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 1.5 units</b> <b>Grade Only</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b> <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. Medical Assisting 110 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Medical Assisting 104 or Medical Assisting 66. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> Special Admission - must be admitted to program. This course is designed to prepare Allied Health students to work in physicians' offices, clinics, hospitals, and other medical areas.
