***Note from the Chancellor's Office***

*In 2006, the Chancellor's Office became aware that a statement in "The Program and Course Approval Handbook" (2003) contradicted the requirements for a major in Title 5 Section 55063. The statement allowed community colleges to offer "transfer studies degrees." which were intended to provide transfer students with associate degrees after they satisfied the lower-division general education requirements for a CSU or UC. Once it was determined "General Education Transfer Patterns" did not, by themselves, satisfy the requirements for a major, the programs were no longer allowed. The change impacted virtually every California community college.*

*In 2007, Title 5 Section 55063 (a), was revised to allow community colleges to develop associate degrees requiring 18 or more semester units in a major or area of emphasis. California community colleges were provided with an opportunity to request to convert a "non-compliant degree" to a "compliant degree or certificate of achievement."*

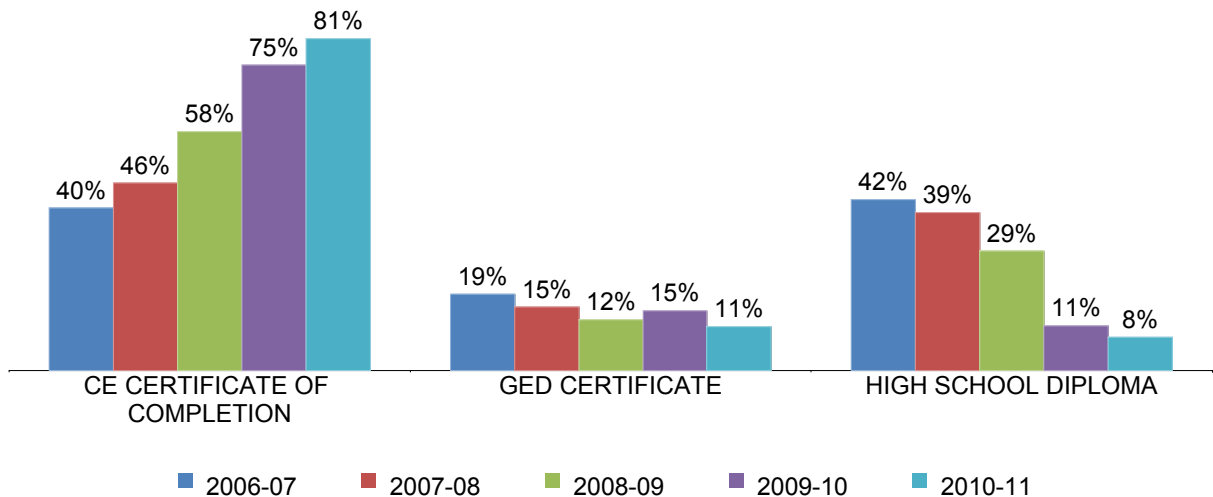
