Chapter 2 - Board of Trustees

BP 2432 - CHANCELLOR SUCCESSION

The Board of Trustees delegates authority to the Chancellor to appoint an acting Chancellor to serve in the Chancellor's absence for short periods of time, not to exceed 30 calendar days at a time.

If the Chancellor is unavailable, and when an acting chancellor has not been named, the Board President shall designate the administrative responsibility to a member of the executive management team for periods of 30 days or less. If the Board President is unavailable, designation shall be made by the first available Executive Vice President, or Vice Presidents in order of greatest seniority.

If a Board member disagrees with the administrator selected, they can ask that the matter be agendized at the next scheduled public Board meeting, or a special public meeting called for this topic.

The Board shall appoint during a public meeting an Acting Chancellor for periods exceeding 30 calendar days due to the Chancellor's absence. In the event that the Chancellor position is vacant, the Board may appoint an interim Chancellor until a regular appointment is made. Appointment of an Interim Chancellor may not exceed two years.
