Background

- Intended to provide broad transparency and accountability.
- Provides measures of progress towards specific outcomes including:
 - Completion Rate
 - Persistence Rate
 - 30+ Unit Completion Rate
 - Remedial Rate
 - Career Technical Education (CTE) Completion Rate
 - Career Development and College Preparation (CDCP) Rate All indicators are measured as cohorts, and tracked over a specified period of time.
- Links to full reports available on college and Continuing Education website.



Overview of Student Success Scorecard Measures

- Expanded college profile data:
 - Headcount by gender, age, and ethnicity
 - FTES
 - Total number of credit and non-credit sections
 - Median credit class size
 - Percent of full-time faculty (Districtwide full-time faculty obligation)
 - Student to counseling ratio
- All outcome measures are reported by:
 - College-prepared and underprepared
 - Gender
 - Ethnicity
 - Age

Completion Rates

Completion Rate

City	65%	54%	56%
Mesa	73%	50%	58%
Miramar	69%	43%	51%
Statewide	70%	39%	47%

- Although still above the statewide average, the *overall* completion rates at all three colleges declined compared to last year's report (City -8%, Mesa -3%, Miramar -3%).
- The *Prepared* group saw a decline at all three colleges compared to last year (City -13%, Mesa -2%, Miramar -2%).
- The *Unprepared* groups also saw declines at all three colleges compared to last year's report (City -4%, Mesa -3%, Miramar -3%).

Persistence Rates

Statewide	73%	71%	72%

- The *overall* persistence rates at all three colleges trended upward compared to last year's report, and remained above the statewide average (City 1%, Mesa 1%, Miramar 5%).
- The *Unprepared* group at the three colleges also saw an upward trend, and remained above the statewide average (City 2%, Mesa 2%, Miramar 5%).
- Persistence rates for the *Prepared* group were mixed, Miramar was the only college that had an upward trend compared to the previous year's report (City -9%, Mesa -1%, Miramar 5%).



30 Unit Completion Rate

Miramar	72%	68%	69%
Statewide	71%	65%	67%

- The rates for the *overall* completion of 30 or more units were mixed at the three colleges compared to last year's report (City 2%, Mesa 1%, Miramar -1%).
- The *Unprepared* groups at the three colleges showed mixed trends compared to last year (City 0%, Mesa -1%, Miramar -2%).
- The *Prepared* groups at the three colleges showed higher rates than last year's report (City 9%, Mesa 6%, Miramar 2%).



Remedial Rate

Miramar	30%	51%	26%
Statewide	31%	43%	28%

- The remedial rates dropped in *math* at all three colleges compared to last year (City -8%, Mesa -7%, Miramar -8%), after an increase over 2012/13 (City 1%, Mesa 5%, Miramar 2%).
- **English** remedial rates were mixed with all but Mesa showing an increase over last year's rates (City 3%, Mesa -2%, Miramar 5%).
- City and Miramar showed an increase in *ESL* remedial rates over last year (City 5%, Mesa -1%, Miramar 1%).



Career Technical Education Completion Rate

Career Technical Education (CTE) Completion Rate

Miramar	46%	
Statewide	51%	

- Miramar's *CTE* completion rate remained the same as last year, while City's and Mesa's rates dropped (-2% and -5%, respectively). However, both City and Mesa showed a slight increase when comparing last year to the previous year (City 2%, Mesa 1%).
- Miramar was the only college that was below the statewide average this year, likely due to the large number of students taking only in-service classes.

• The **CDCP** rate at Continuing Education remained the same as last year, and also remained below the statewide average.
