#### **Background**

- Established in 2004 as Assembly Bill AB 1417 (Pacheco)
- Framework for an annual evaluation of California community colleges
- Measurable performance indicators developed by the Chancellor's Office in consultation with researchers
- 2009 represents the fourth formal year of reporting ARCC indicators

#### **ARCC Indicators**

- 1. Student Progress and Achievement Rate: Degree, Certificate or Transfer
- 2. Percent of Students Who Showed Intent to Complete and Earned at Least 30 Units
- 3. Annual Persistence Rate
- 4. Annual Successful Course Completion Rate for Credit Vocational Courses
- 5. Annual Successful Course Completion Rate for Credit Basic Skills Courses
- 6. Improvement Rates for Credit ESL and Basic Skills Courses
- 7. CDCP Progress and Achievement Rate

#### Peer Groups

- Groupings of colleges through a statistical process called *cluster analysis* which groups factors that have proven to affect or predict the outcome.
- Some of the factors used include:
  - Student demographics
  - Proximity to a university
  - Economic Service Area Index of household income
  - Average unit load
  - Percentage of adult males in the student population
  - Percent of student population receiving financial aid
  - Number of English-as-a-second language speakers

## Data Exploration – 2009

### Critical Reporting Differences

- IRP Report excluded remedial level English and Math courses (more than 2 courses below transfer), ARCC included them.
- IRP Report tracked student improvement within the SDCCD colleges only, ARCC tracked student improvement across the California community college system.
- IRP Report used the District's course sequence, ARCC used an approximation of the sequence.
- IRP Report excluded the Basic Skills sections offered at SDSU and UCSD, ARCC included them.

## City, Mesa, Miramar Sample Strategies for Improving ARCC Indicators

- 1. Use of information from Program Review and SLO assessments to improve programs and services.
- 2. On-line tutoring, supplemental instruction and instructional assistants for Basic Skills math, English and ESOL
- 3. First Year Experience program and other Learning Communities (i.e., Puente, New Horizons, TRIO, and Umoja)
- 4. Academic Success Center (one-stop academic support center)
- 5. Proactive awarding of degrees (students with 45+ units contacted to meet w/ counselor to begin application process for graduation)
