

#### NATIONAL TRENDS IN COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENROLLMENT


- Community College enrollment increased between 2000-2010
- Since 2010 community college enrollment has declined
- Between 2012-2015 enrollment declined 2.4% to 4.4%
  - In this same time period SDCCD enrollment has increased almost 10%

### ENROLLMENT DASHBOARD

- From 2011/12 to 2015/16 the number of sections increased by 29%, and FTES increased by 8%.
- The recovery of enrollments after several years of section reduction is slower than usual due to the shift in the economy and resulting uptick in employment.



### FTES BY COLLEGE

- FTES/enrollment between 2011/12 and 2013/14 there was a slight dip in enrollment followed by a significant increase the last two years.
- In 2015-2016, FTES for City increased by 1.5%, Mesa by nearly 1%, and Miramar by 6% compared to 2014-2015.
- CE increased by 4% between 2013/14 and 2014/15, and remained relatively flat in 2015-2016.



### CREDIT COLLEGE FTES BY MODALITY

- Online FTES increased by 25% from 2011/12 to 2015/16, and 11% from 2014/15 to 2015/16.
- On average, online classes have comprised 12% of the total number of sections offered at the credit colleges.
- In Fall 2016, online classes comprise 13% of the total class offerings due to a strategic direction to increase online classes



### CREDIT COLLEGES FTES BY DAY/EVE


- FTES for day sections increased by 14% over the past five years, while FTES for evening classes decreased by 15%.
- The number of sections offered during the day increased by 35% from 2011/12 to 2015/16.

### CREDIT COLLEGES FILL RATES


Fill Rates have declined over the past five years due to an increase in class sections, resulting in greater class capacity.

## SDCCD STUDENTS BY AGE

- The majority of students enrolled districtwide continue to be 18 to 24 years old.
- The number of students 50 years and older students have decreased by about 10% over the past five years.

# SDCCD STUDENTS: ETHNICITY

- The Latino student population has increased by 8% over the past five years and has grown to 35% of the districtwide student population.
- The percent of White students decreased to 32% of the student population. This is a 12% decrease over the past five years.
