COLLEGE PROGRAM STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

AGE

- Summer students are younger compared to fall and spring:
 - 55% of the students are between 18 and 24 years of age
 - 21% of the students are between 25 and 29 years of age
 - A lower proportion of students are 40 years and older

GENDER

- More female students enroll in summer compared to fall and spring:
 - 52% of the students are female compared to 50% in fall and spring
 - Most notable increase in females is at Miramar College
 - 48% in summer compared to 44% in fall and 43% in spring

ETHNICITY

• Ethnic profile about the same as fall and spring

- 36% Latino
- 31% White
- 12% Asian/Pacific Islander
- 8% African American

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AT A 4-YEAR INSTITUTION

• Nearly double the population of students are concurrently enrolled at a 4-year institution

- 11% of students enrolled in **summer** report they are concurrently enrolled at a 4-year institution
- 6% of **fall** and **spring** students report being concurrently enrolled at a 4-year institution

EDUCATIONAL GOAL

• More students are preparing to transfer

- 51% of summer students indicate transfer as their educational goal
- 48% of the **fall** and **spring** students indicate they plan to transfer

PRIOR ENROLLMENT

 About one third of the students across all colleges were not enrolled the previous spring or fall semester

- 34% were not enrolled in spring 2015
- 30% were not enrolled in the fall 2014
