# Pandemic Relief for SDCCD Students

### \$97 million of federal stimulus through the federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF)

- \$35Mil Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act December, 2020 (HEERF II)
- \$62Mil American Rescue Plan of 2021 (HEERF III)
- A minimum \$38Mil in direct aid payments to help students financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, remaining funds to support instructional and operational costs to help the SDCCD cover added expenses due to the crisis.

## Key Learning from DSPS Student Statewide Research

- Supporting students with disabilities is an institutional responsibility - all stakeholders must be at the table and on board!
- CARES Act Funds can be utilized to support access.
- Anticipate and understand student needs related to access.
- Ensure responsiveness when accommodation is requested.
- Listen and learn from students with disabilities.
- Increase visibility of students with disabilities, and of faculty and staff with disabilities. (RP GROUP, 2021)



## Fall 2019 to Fall 2020 Enrollment Comparison


#### Non-Credit College: Fall to Fall Enrollment




# Credit Colleges: Fall to Fall Enrollment Non-DSPS Students DSPS Students Only



A modern concept of disability is described as an interaction between an individual's personal condition (such as being in a wheelchair or having a visual impairment) and environmental factors (such as negative attitudes or inaccessible buildings) which together lead to disability and affect an individual's participation in society.

# (Repefining Disability



Frida Kahlo was a Mexican painter who will be forever remembered for her vibrant colors, self-portraits, and unique vision & depiction of life.

Frida Kahlo had polio as a child and she was in a bus accident as a teenager. While recovering and going through 30 operations, she spent months in bed and she started focusing on her paintings. Her personal experience with disability influenced how she portrayed the human experience of pain; acknowledging its existence, but refusing to be defined by it.

She has also been described as not being afraid of challenging gender stereotypes both in her life and in her paintings.

In honor of Latinx heritage month, let us celebrate the life and contributions of Frida Kahlo. A world renowned artist who has touched the hearts of many and brought a different perspective on the reality of the people of Mexico, women, gender, and people with disabilities.....and what it means to follow your heart, passion, and live your most authentic life.

- I have a condition called cerebral palsy that impacts my fine motor skills and my speech.
   Some people who don't know me may have a hard time understanding my speech so I use my iPhone or my iPad and type what I want to say and it can even voice it for me. This allows me to participate in workgroups.
- I made a PowerPoint for today's presentation to go along with my speech so that others can understand everything that I'm saying.
- Because of these challenges, I only take one or two classes per semester which allows me to work successfully towards my academic goals and maintain a great GPA so that I can remain competitive when applying for transfer.

# My Academic Career Path

- I want to complete all the requirement classes to obtain my Associates
   Degree. Then I will do the transfer requirement classes to go to San Diego State.
- After I get my Associates, I would like to get a job and start working while I'm still in school.
