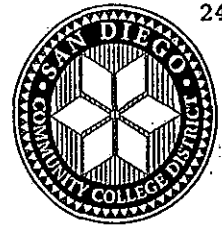

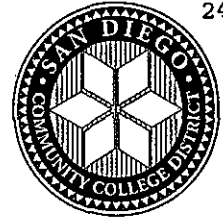

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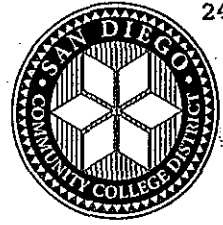

Maria Bolivar - Faculty Member, Mesa College

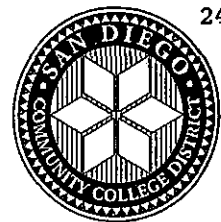
Dr. Bolivar provided a written statement to the Board. She addressed the Board on some of the issues described in her written statement. She alleges that the Mesa T-2 room is, in her opinion, ill-equipped and lacking in technology; only one session of Spanish is offered for the large population of Heritage Speakers; the textbook she is mandated to use has stereotypical depictions; some of the documents in the letters of appraisal were only seen by her two days ago; and she has been accused of inflating grades and participating in intimidating practices, complaints of which she has never seen in writing.

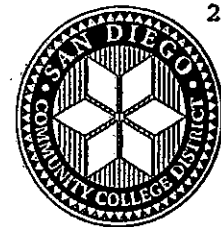

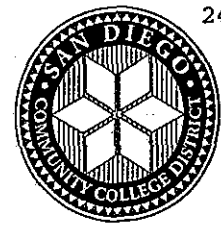

She also provided an update on the statewide Taskforce on Student Success of which she and Chancellor Carroll are members. A new interactive website has been established to allow opportunity for interested persons to provide input about strategies to improve student success.

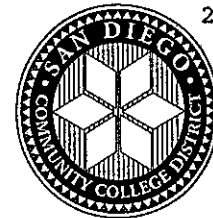

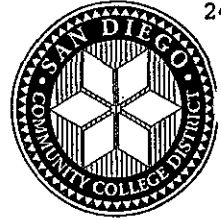

150 REPORT ON COMMUNICATIONS/STATEWIDE & LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

Chancellor Constance Carroll

Chancellor Carroll reported that the Governor's March 10 deadline for approving a state budget within the 60-day timeline he had set has passed. There is still no resolution of several issues between the political parties, especially regarding the two-thirds approval level needed to place tax extensions before the voters in a June ballot. Governor Brown will continue to negotiate with legislators, with the goal of reaching an agreement that would result in a later approval date for both the budget action and the June ballot.

The Chancellor noted that without the June ballot measures passing, the California Community Colleges reduction would double. The SDCCD impact would increase from a budget cut of \$10,062,000 (-5.2%) to a cut of \$17,696,000 (-9.1%). Advocacy efforts are continuing.



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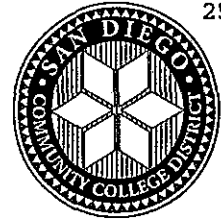

171 Student Trustee

- 1. Student Trustee Alberto Vasquez provided updated information regarding the career fair coordinated by the student government bodies at the colleges and Continuing Education scheduled for April 14, hosted by Mesa College. Transportation will be provided for Continuing Education students.
2. He also indicated that student representatives will be in attendance at the "March in March" Advocacy Day in Sacramento on March 14. A Day of Action rally in downtown San Diego is also being planned for the end of April/early May.
3. Cultural forums for men of color are being hosted by City College on March 11, and by Mesa College on March 18.
4. He ended his report expressing the concern of many students regarding the recent announcement of UCSD plans to raise the transfer GPA requirement from 3.0 to 3.5, effective fall 2012, which will close the door on many students who plan to attend a UC institution.

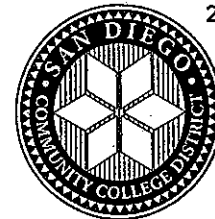
1. Trustee Graham reported that the Board subcommittee on Accreditation and Student Learning Outcomes had reviewed and was impressed by the colleges' development of learning communities and the resulting improvements in student retention and success. She said that they also had reviewed elements that mandatory assessment and placement would require. She thanked Vice Chancellor Lynn Neault and Director Cathy Hasson and staff for their presentation and research.

2. She also thanked all the District's presenters and volunteers for an extraordinary job in co-hosting the national Innovations 2011 Conference held last week.

173 Maria Nieto Senour

Trustee Senour also shared concerns regarding the announcement of a change in UCSD's transfer criteria for 2012 in which the GPA requirement will be increased from 3.0 to 3.5. This will have a fiscal impact on the SDCCD as students need to take additional community college classes to raise their GPA, in addition to a serious impact on the morale of students as they find they no longer qualify for transfer to UCSD. She requested that the SDCCD and other districts get involved in countering this issue and asked for information on the number of students that would be impacted.

Chancellor Carroll noted this issue has been discussed at the San Diego and Imperial Counties Community Colleges Association (SDICCCA) and that the SDCCD Academic Senates are also actively discussing this situation. She added that that approximately 50% of transfer students across the District would be negatively affected by this change.

Trustee Zschiesche commented on state budget negotiations and the recent action of the San Diego City Council, which voted to change the process for allocating redevelopment funds, with possible negative consequences for community college and school districts.
