BP 3300 - STUDENT FEE SCHEDULE – ATTACHMENT A FEE SCHEDULE FOR 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR EFFECTIVE FALL 2017

This policy enumerates all mandatory and optional student fees authorized by statute.

1. MANDATORY FEES

The following fees are mandated by state law and are charged to students as a condition of enrollment.

- a. ENROLLMENT FEES shall be charged to all students who enroll in college credit classes as follows:
 - 1) The fee charged shall be forty six dollars (\$46.00) per unit. Half units shall be charged at twenty three dollars (\$23.00).
 - 2) The charges above shall be determined using the highest cumulative number of units during any semester, intersession, summer session, or term.
 - 3) Students receiving credit by examination shall be charged forty six dollars (\$46.00) per unit, consistent with the enrollment fee.
- b. NONRESIDENT TUITION shall be assessed of all college students who are classified as nonresidents in accordance with BP and AP 5015 Residence Determination (Education Code section 68000, et seq.). The fee shall be \$221.00 per unit or fraction of a unit for all college classes.
- c. BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM FEES shall be charged to students for all upper division coursework.
 - 1) The fee shall be eighty four dollars (\$84.00) per unit in addition to the enrollment fee of \$46.00 per unit.
 - 2) Nonresident students shall be charged the eighty four dollars (\$84.00) per unit in addition to the enrollment fee of \$46.00 per unit, and the nonresident tuition fee of \$221.00 per unit.
- d. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICATION FEE of \$100.00 shall be charged to all students who are residents and citizens of a foreign country. The fee is non-refundable and will be credited toward nonresident tuition when the student registers (California Education Code, Section 76142).
- e. REFUNDS in full are authorized when a student officially withdraws before the refund deadline:
 - 1) The refund deadline is determined by the length of the session. For Primary 16 week session the deadline shall be the Friday of the second week of the session. For classes of 16 weeks (other than the Primary session) or more the deadline shall be the

Monday of the third week of the session. For short-term sessions, which are less than 16 weeks, the deadline shall be Monday of the second week of the session. For sessions of one week or less, a list of the deadlines is available in the Admissions Office on campus.

- 2) When a reduction in units of enrollment results from an action of the district to reschedule or cancel a class students automatically receive a refund in the mail or credit to their credit cards. Refunds will be automatically sent to students after the add/drop deadline. After the second calendar week of instruction, fees may be transferred from one course to another due to movement up or down in a subject area, or change in schedule due to circumstances beyond the control of the student.

- f. HEALTH FEES are mandated and are charged to students as a condition of enrollment (California Education Code Section 76355).

- 1) The fee will include health services and accident insurance.
- 2) The following students exempt from the health fee:
 - a) Students who meet the income standards for the Board of Governors Waiver (BOGW-A only).
 - b) Students attending only apprenticeship classes under an approved apprenticeship program.
 - c) Students who depend on prayer for healing, in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination, or organization.

Refund of the health fee shall be consistent with the district's refund policy.

- g. STUDENT REPRESENTATION FEE is assessed of all students enrolled in at least one college class for the purpose of student advocacy efforts to federal, state and local governments (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Sections 54801-54805).

Refund of the representation fee shall be consistent with the district's refund policy.

Students have the right to refuse to pay the fee for religious, moral, political or financial reasons (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 54805).

h. CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) CLASS FEES

- 1) Course fees for all community education classes will range from \$5.00 per student per instructional hour to \$17.00 per student per instructional hour depending on the full cost of instruction for the class. The full cost of instruction includes: program management, marketing, facilities, custodial, and ADA accommodations.
- 2) No fee class shall be offered unless specifically approved by the Board. Fees for the entire term of the class shall be paid at the time of registration.
- 3) The number of paid fees required to open a class, shall vary based on the cost of instruction.
- 4) A refund will be made if Community Education cancels a class or is unable to continue the class. If the student requests a refund at least three (3) business days prior to the start of the class, a full refund will be granted. There are no other refunds beyond the three (3) day period.
- 5) Students enrolling later than the first class session shall pay the full class fee.
- 6) Additional fees collected over the minimum shall be allocated to cover indirect program costs.
- 7) Auditing or visitors shall not be permitted.
- 8) Administrative time and cost to implement and supervise the fee classes shall be kept to an absolute minimum.

i. TEST PROCTORING SERVICES FEES

- 1) Up to 4 hours: \$50.00
- 2) More than 4 hours: \$100.00

The fee will be waived for any student currently enrolled in a California community college.

i. PROPERTY FABRICATION CHARGE

Fabrication or construction of products by students with district-owned materials which the student wishes to retain for private use and ownership and for which transfer of ownership is authorized by the district shall be provided to the student at cost district-wide.

I. BOOKS, EQUIPMENT AND MATERIAL

Additionally, a charge of \$0.25 per day excluding holidays will also be assessed per item after the imposition of the overdue fine until the accumulated charges equal the cost for the library to replace the book from a library vendor. Note: Not applicable for ECC.
Circulating Library Reserve Materials	A \$2.00 overdue fine shall be assessed per item for failure to return Reserve Library on posted due date. Additionally, a charge of \$.50 per day will also be assessed per item after the imposition of the overdue fine until the accumulated charges equal the cost for the library to replace the book from a library vendor, plus a \$7.00 processing fee.
Reserve Library Use Only - Print Materials	A fine of \$5.00 per day shall be assessed per item for the unauthorized removal of print (e.g., books, photocopies) <i>Reserve Library Use Only</i> materials from the library until the accumulated charges equal the cost for the library to replace the book from a library vendor.
Reserve Library Use Only - Non-Print Media	A fine of \$10.00 per day shall be assessed per item for unauthorized removal of non-print (e.g., videos, CD-ROMs) <i>Reserve Library Use Only</i> materials from the library until the accumulated charges equal the cost for the library to replace the book from a library vendor.
