Chapter 5 – Student Services

AP 5310 - Shower Facilities for Homeless Students

The District maintains shower facilities for student use on the college campuses that may be used by any homeless student, during designated hours, who is enrolled in a minimum of three (3) units of coursework, has paid enrollment fees, is in good standing with the District, and is under the age of 25 years of age.

Each college will identify the hours of operation that designated shower facilities will be available to homeless students that does not interfere with intercollegiate team access. A locker room attendant will be assigned to facilitate access during designated hours.

A homeless student is defined as a student under the age of 25 who does not have a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. This includes, but is not limited to, students who: are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings; or are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.

Eligible students shall be referred to the EOPS office on campus for information about available support services, including access to shower facilities, priority registration, food pantry access, DSPS, financial aid, and referral to community agencies.
