# **Distance Education Update**

November 7, 2024

#### **Overview**

This briefing contains information about trends in enrollment and outcomes by modality for courses at SDCCD over the last five years. Data is presented for each academic year. Data for 2019-20 reflects courses as they were originally scheduled; while all instruction was transitioned online midway through the Spring term, courses were scheduled largely on-campus in line with scheduling patterns before the pandemic.

Enrollment data includes duplicated enrollments, headcount, and success rates. Section counts are referenced in places.


Data for The College of Continuing Education (SDCCE) is included in this briefing for the first time. Enrollment data for SDCCE generally reflects all enrollments at that college. Success rate data for SDCCE reflects graded enrollments only; sections that do not assign grades and duplicate course enrollments are excluded<sup>1</sup>. Success rate data for SDCCE and the credit colleges is reported separately in this briefing; pending districtwide discussion of success definitions, this data may be aggregated.

#### **Link to Data**

A dashboard with <u>Distance Education Enrollments and Outcomes</u> is available for further disaggregation of findings in this report. Often, District- and college-level trends in enrollment and success do not hold true at the department, subject, and course level. Practitioners and leadership are strongly encouraged to explore trends within their program using the dashboard. The four tabs of the dashboard provide four views of distance education data.



In most tabs, data can be disaggregated using the following filters.

#### **Definitions-General**

- **Enrollments**: Duplicated instances of students taking a course. One student enrolled in two courses is counted twice. Enrollments are as of course census; students that drop before course census are excluded.
- Graded Enrollments: enrollments in sections that assign letter grades. At the credit
  colleges, all enrollments are graded. At The College of Continuing Education
  (SDCCE), graded enrollments are those in sections in which students received
  grades; in cases where students enrolled in multiple sections of the same course in
  the same term, only the enrollment that received the highest grade is included.
- **Headcount**: Unduplicated count of students. One student enrolled in two courses counts once.
- Success Rate: At the credit colleges, the percentage of students who complete a
  course with a grade of A, B, C, or P out of total official census enrollments. At SDCCE,
  passing grades include a grade of "SP" and/or a CE Satisfactory Completion value of
  "S". At the credit colleges, tutoring, non-credit, and cancelled classes are excluded. At
  SDCCD, cancelled classes are excluded.

#### **Definitions-Section Modalities**

- Online: Sections offered online, including Fully Online, Online-live, and Hyflex, in
  which students may attend completely online. The CCCCO MIS Data Element
  Dictionary provides the following definition of *Distance Education* courses: "Distance
  Education means instruction in which the instructor and student are separated by time
  and/or distance and interact through the assistance of technology."
  - Fully Online: Sections offered online with no set meeting time (asynchronous).
     These are a subset of Online enrollments.
  - Online-live: Sections offered online with set meeting time (synchronous).
     These are a subset of Online enrollments.
  - Hyflex: Sections offered in which students may attend fully online, fully onground, or any possible combination of online and on-ground. These are a subset of Online enrollments.
- On-ground: "Face to face" sections, in which the instructor and students physically
  occupy the same place at the same time. This includes sections offered on-campus
  and off-campus (such as CCAP sections offered on high school campuses) sections.
- Partially Online: Sections that include components both in online and on-campus modalities.

#### **Summary**

- 1. Enrollments by Modality: In 2023-24, there were 307,109 enrollments across the San Diego Community College District. 150,635 were online (49% of the total), 125,156 were on-ground (41%), and 31,318 enrollments were partially online (10%).
- 2. The Transition to Online Instruction, Credit Colleges, Key Finding #1.1: Across the credit colleges, students were almost twice as likely to take a class online in 2023-24 than before the pandemic. However, this varies by group, with female, African American, and older students more likely to enroll online in 2023-24 than their peers.
- 3. The Transition to Online Instruction, SDCCE, Key Finding #1.2: At SDCCE, students were more than twice as likely to take a class online in 2023-24 than before the pandemic. However, this varies by group, with female, Native American, Multi-Ethnicity, Asian, and older students more likely to enroll online in 2023-24 than their peers.
- **4.** Fully Online and Online-live Enrollments: 3,524 Fully Online sections accounted for 75% of online enrollments Districtwide in 2023-24. Fully Online sections are much more prevalent at the Credit Colleges (93% of enrollments in 2023-24) than at SDCCE (18%).
- **5.** Headcount by Modality: 57,423 students enrolled in an online or partially online course in 2023-24 across SDCCD (City: 16,974, Mesa: 25,415, Miramar: 17,286, SDCCE: 15,525), or 73% of students (City: 78%, Mesa: 84%, Miramar: 71%, SDCCE: 63%).
- **6.** Distance Education Facilitates Student Swirl: About half of the students who attended each credit college in 2023-24 also attended another credit college (City: 54%, Mesa: 48%, Miramar: 47%). Across the credit colleges, this was 16,250 students, nearly all of whom (96%) enrolled online during 2023-24.
- 7. Success Rate by Modality, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges in 2023-24, 74% of enrollments online were successful (City: 71%, Mesa: 74%, Miramar: 75%), an increase of 2% compared to 2023-24.
- **8.** Success Rate by Modality, SDCCE: At SDCCE in 2023-24, 67% of the 25,954 graded enrollments were successful, a 2% increase from 2022-23.
- 9. Online Success by Online-live/Fully Online: At the credit colleges, success rates in Fully Online courses are generally similar to success rates in Online-live courses, although this varies by college and course. At SDCCE, success rates in Online-live courses have been about 15% higher than those in Fully Online courses over the last two years.
- **10.** Online Success by Ethnicity, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges, gaps in online success rates remain largest for African American and Latinx students, although significant gaps exist for all groups (compared to a reference group Asian students).

**Key Finding #2:** Since 2019-20, success rates for Latinx students at the credit colleges have been between 15% and 17% lower than for Asian students in transfer-level online coursework. For African American students, who enroll online at the highest rates, success rates have been 19% to 21% lower.

- **11. Online Success by Ethnicity, SDCCE**: At SDCCE, gaps in online success rates have decreased somewhat since 2022-23 (compared to a reference group Asian students).
- **12.** Online Success by Age, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges in 2023-24, success rates were between 68% and 75% in Online transfer-level for all age groups except students over 50. For students over 50, 63% of enrollments were successful.
- **13. Online Success by Age, SDCCE:** At SDCCE in 2023-24, success rates were between 62% and 73% in Online graded sections for all age groups except students 18-24. For students 18-24, 57% of enrollments were successful.

#### **Metrics**

1. Enrollments by Modality, Districtwide: In 2023-24, there were 307,109 enrollments across the San Diego Community College District. 150,635 were online (49% of the total), 125,156 were on-ground (41%), and 31,318 enrollments were partially online (10%).

Online courses accounted for a steadily increasing proportion of enrollments districtwide through 2019-20 – up to just under 1 out of every 4 enrollments in 2019-20. Instruction was transitioned almost entirely online in 2020-21, with 95% of enrollments occurring entirely online that year.


In 2021-22, the count of online enrollments decreased 25% from the prior year as on-ground instruction was reactivated; in 2022-23, online enrollments decreased another 26% from the prior year. There were 5% fewer online enrollments in 2023-24 than 2022-23, and on-ground enrollments grew 33%.

Across the credit colleges in 2023-24, online enrollments accounted for 48% of all enrollments (City: 47%, Mesa: 50%, Miramar: 44%). At SDCCE in 2023-24, online enrollments accounted for 54% of all enrollments.

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Figure 2. Annual Enrollment count (duplicated) by modality, Districtwide



The Transition to Online Instruction by Group, Credit Colleges: Across the credit colleges, students were almost twice as likely to take a class online in 2023-24 than before the pandemic. However, this varies by group, with female, African American, and older students more likely to enroll online in 2023-24 than their peers.

Online enrollment varies by college, program, and group, as does growth in online enrollment.


- By College: In 2023-24, students are similarly likely to enroll online at City and Mesa, and less likely to enroll online at Miramar (44%). This is due to large programs at Miramar that are mostly oncampus, such as Fire Protection and Administration of Justice.
- By Gender: Similar to before the pandemic, female students are much more likely to enroll online (52% of enrollments online in 2023-24) than male students.
- By Ethnicity: African American students are more likely to enroll online (55% of enrollments online in 2023-24) than other ethnicities, followed by Asian students (51%) and Multi-Ethnicity students (49%).
- By Age: Older students are more likely to enroll online, with 50% to 54% of enrollments by students older than 25 occurring online.

3. The Transition to Online Instruction by Group, SDCCE: At SDCCE, students were more than twice as likely to take a class online in 2023-24 than before the pandemic. However, this varies by group, with female, Native American, Multi-Ethnicity, Asian, and older students more likely to enroll online in 2023-24 than their peers.

Online enrollment varies by college, program, and group, as does growth in online enrollment.


- **By Gender:** Similar to before the pandemic, female students are much more likely to enroll online (58% of enrollments online in 2023-24) than male students.
- By Ethnicity: Native American, Multi-Ethnicity, and Asian students are more likely to enroll online (61%-69% of enrollments online in 2023-24).
- By Age: Older students are more likely to enroll online, with 55% to 59% of enrollments by students older than 25 occurring online.

#### 4. Fully Online (Asynchronous) and Online-live (Synchronous) Enrollments: 3,524

Fully Online sections accounted for 73% of online enrollments districtwide in 2023-24. Fully Online enrollments are much more prevalent at the Credit Colleges (93% of enrollments in 2023-24) than at SDCCE (16%).

As on-ground instruction has been reactivated in the wake of the pandemic, the credit colleges have scheduled more Fully Online sections and SDCCE has scheduled fewer.


At the credit colleges in 2020-21, almost 1 in 3 online enrollments were in online-live courses; in 2023-24, online-live enrollments accounted for less than 1 in 10 online enrollments. Between 0.2% and 0.5% of online enrollments have been accounted for by Hyflex sections.

At SDCCE in 2020-21, two-thirds of enrollments were in online-live courses; in 2023-24, online-live enrollments accounted for more than 70% of online enrollments. Hyflex sections accounted for 12% of enrollments in 2023-24.

Enrollment proportions by modality are influenced by course offerings and student preference. Enrollment proportions largely follow scheduling patterns (see Table 6 for section counts by Fully Online, Online-Live, and Hyflex). Findings from the <u>Distance Education Student Experience Survey</u> (Fall 2023) suggest that course offerings are generally aligned with student modality preferences (Credit Colleges largely schedule Fully Online sections, SDCCE largely schedules Online-Live).

5. Headcount by Modality: 57,423 students enrolled in an online or partially online course in 2023-24 across SDCCD (City: 16,974, Mesa: 25,415, Miramar: 17,286, SDCCE: 15,525), or 73% of students (City: 78%, Mesa: 84%, Miramar: 71%, SDCCE: 63%).

In 2023-24, students who only enrolled in Online accounted for 44% of students across the district, students who enrolled in both Online and Online & On-ground classes accounted for another 29%, and students who enrolled only On-ground accounted for 27%.

These trends differ by career: compared to students at the credit colleges, students from SDCCE are more likely to enroll online only (51%, compared to 41% of credit college students) and onground only (37%, compared to 23% of credit college students). Students are more likely to enroll online across the credit colleges than at one college; for more on student swirl, see section 6.

Figure 4. Headcount Proportion (unduplicated) by Modality, Districtwide



6. Distance Education Facilitates Student Swirl: About half of the students who attended each credit college in 2023-24 also attended another credit college (City: 54%, Mesa: 48%, Miramar: 47%). Across the credit colleges, this was 16,250 students, nearly all of whom (96%) enrolled online during 2023-24.




Figure 5. 2023-24 Student Swirl at the Credit Colleges Facilitated by Distance Education

There were 16,250 unduplicated students who attended multiple credit colleges in 2023-24 (green rows in Table 10, inside green circle in Figure 5). Nearly all of these students enrolled in at least one distance education class that year.

Table 11 below shows the modalities in which students enrolled at each of the credit colleges. Students who only enroll at one college are more likely to enroll on-ground only, while students that enroll at multiple credit colleges are much more likely to enroll in a distance education course (green highlighted cells).

The 16,250 students enrolled across the credit colleges in 2023-24 did so in various combinations of on-ground and online classes: 96% of students who enrolled at multiple credit colleges in 2023-24 enrolled in at least one Online or Online & On-ground class.

Figure 5 below visualizes the proportion of students at each college who "swirled," or enrolled at multiple colleges during the 2023-24 academic year. The red circle graph represents City College students, blue represents Mesa, and teal represents Miramar. The portion of each circle graph that appears inside the green circle is the number of students from that college who also enrolled at at least one other credit college.

For example, 21,669 students enrolled at City College in 2023-24: 9,996 enrolled only at City, and 11,673 enrolled at City and at least one other credit college. Of the 9,996 who enrolled only at City, 69% enrolled in a distance education class (sum of green highlighted cells in Table 10). Of the 11,673 students who enrolled at City and another college, 87% enrolled in a distance education class.

The impact of distance education courses is even more evident when considering the 16,250 students who enrolled at multiple credit colleges: students often enroll only on-ground at one college, but online or in an online & on-ground class at another college.

7. Success Rate by Modality, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges in 2023-24, 74% of enrollments in online transfer-level courses were successful (City: 71%, Mesa: 74%, Miramar: 75%), an increase of 2% compared to 2023-24.

Success rates in transfer level online courses at the credit colleges rose to 75% in 2020-21, returned to pre-pandemic levels in 2021-22, and have been rising steadily since.

In 2020-21 at the credit colleges, success rates in transfer level on-ground courses rose to 93%; this was as the number of on-campus enrollment decreased to 7,612 (these enrollments were largely in Administrative Justice and Fire Protection at Miramar College, and Veterinary Technology, Radiologic Technology, and Dental Assisting at Mesa College). As on-campus instruction was reactivated through 2023-24 and the number of on-campus enrollments increased to over 85,000, success rates in transfer level courses taught on-campus decreased to 77%.




Figure 6. Success Rates in Transfer Level Coursework, Credit Colleges



## 8. Success Trends at SDCCE: At SDCCE in 2023-24, 67% of the 25,954 graded enrollments were successful, a 2% increase from 2022-23.

SDCCE success rates are based on unduplicated attempts in graded sections, which is a subset of all enrollments at the college For more context on the number of graded enrollments, other attempts, and non-graded sections, see Table 22 on page 29. In this report, unduplicated attempts in graded sections are referred to as "**graded enrollments**" (green highlight in Table 22). For more context on success calculations for SDCCE, see the Definitions section (page 2) or Appendix page 29.

Of the 98,869 enrollments at SDCCE in 2019-20, 43,147 were graded. 7,212 graded enrollments were online (17% of graded enrollments) and 73% of those were successful. The number of online graded enrollments ballooned to 36,077 in 2020-21 (99.3% of graded enrollments), and success rates decreased to 66%. Success rates decreased again in 2021-22 to 64%. Then, as the number of online graded enrollments decreased in each of the next two years, success rates gradually increased.

9. Online Success by Online-live/Fully Online: At the credit colleges, success rates in Fully Online (Asynchronous) courses are generally similar to success rates in Online-live (Synchronous) courses, although this varies by college and course. At SDCCE, success rates in Online-live courses have been about 15% higher than those in Fully Online courses over the last two years.

At the credit colleges, due to the relatively small and decreasing number of sections offered Online Live, differences in success rates between the two modalities are likely impacted by course- and faculty-level effects. At SDCCE the reverse is true: the majority of online graded sections are Online Live. See section 3 on page 5 for more information about the total number of enrollments and sections in Fully Online, Online Live, and Hyflex modalities.

10. Online Success by Ethnicity, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges, gaps in online success rates remain largest for African American and Latinx students, although significant gaps exist for all groups (compared to a reference group – Asian students).

Since 2019-20, success rates for Latinx students at the credit colleges have been between 15% and 17% lower than for Asian students in transfer-level online coursework. For African American students, success rates have been 19% to 21% lower; supporting success online for African American students is more important than ever as this group is the most likely to enroll online.

Longitudinal comparisons to on-ground success rates are somewhat difficult to make as there were very few on-ground offerings in 2020-21, but gaps in online success rates across the last five years are nonetheless larger and more consistent than those seen on-ground (see Figure 8 and Figure 9).

## 11. Online Success by Ethnicity, SDCCE: At SDCCE, gaps in online success rates have decreased somewhat since 2022-23 (compared to a reference group – Asian students).

Figure 10. Gaps in Online Success Rates from Reference Group (Asian), Graded Enrollments, SDCCE



# 12. Online Success by Age, Credit Colleges: At the credit colleges in 2023-24, success rates were between 68% and 75% in Online transfer-level for all age groups except students over 50. For students over 50, 63% of enrollments were successful.

The transition to online instruction drastically changed enrollment patterns by modality for all age groups: in 2023-24, over half enrollments by all groups over 24 years old were in online classes, and 47% of enrollments by students 18 to 24 years old were online.

Since 2020-21, online success rates have decreased significantly for students over 30 years old, decreases that are likely linked to changes in online course offerings and student enrollment behavior over the last four years.




Figure 11. 2023-24 Online Success Rates in Transfer-level coursework, Credit Colleges

13. Online Success by Age, SDCCE: At SDCCE in 2023-24, success rates were between 62% and 73% in Online graded sections for all age groups except students 18-24. For students 18-24, 57% of enrollments were successful.

The transition to online instruction drastically changed enrollment patterns by modality for all age groups: in 2023-24, over half enrollments by all groups over 24 years old were in online classes, and 44% of enrollments by students 18 to 24 years old were online.

Success rates at SDCCE vary significantly by program and should be disaggregated further on the Distance Education Outcomes Dashboard.




Figure 12. 2023-24 Online Success Rates in Graded Enrollments, SDCCE
