Definitions



OER (Open Educational Resources)

Resources that reside in the public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and re-purposing by others.



ZTC (Zero Textbook Costs) defined in SB 1359

Courses that use digital materials that are free of charge to students and may have a low-cost option for print versions.





- All webinars were recorded and made available for our Faculty on the <u>SDCCD On</u> <u>Demand Website</u>



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

SAN DIEGO COLLEGE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Five OER certificate programs were implemented in Fall 2020 through the ICOM Academy. By Spring, 2022 there will be over 20 programs
- A book loaning program out of the Office of Instructional Services was created to enable CE's hard to convert (H2C) programs and students to continue online
- Fall 2020 Savings examples include:
 - Students in all HLTH, AUTO, MECT, and some ESLA sections were provided loaner or OER materials saving students \$217,599
 - CTE is developing OER/Zero Textbook online materials for courses through ICOM, adding additional sections each semester
 - Students in 215 sections of CTE BIT are using department-purchased/provided materials for most classes. Most of the materials are digital and free to students, saving students more than \$25,055
- The ESL Textbook Committee created and is continually updating an instructor ESL OER Resources list
- Every year the <u>ESL Textbook Committee</u> promotes the <u>Backman Jennings</u> <u>Book Fund</u> which has raised over \$11,000 yearly and distributes book vouchers to students
