<p>161 Juvenile Procedures</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. This course provides an overview of the history, development, and organization of the juvenile justice system in the U.S. Topics include the organization, functions, and jurisdiction of juvenile agencies; juvenile law; the processing and detention of juveniles; juvenile dispositions, statutes, and court procedures; and the Constitutional protections extended to juveniles. <p>182 Street Gangs and Law Enforcement</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Administration of Justice 265. This course presents an overview of street gang issues. Topics include the history of gangs, gang dynamics, criminal activities, differences among gangs, narcotics involvement, and gang philosophy. The course emphasizes the law enforcement perspective for involvement, intervention, prosecution, and intelligence gathering. <p>~49 Introduction to Health Careers</p> <p align="right">24 - 27 hours lecture, 1.5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Mathematics 43 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This introductory course is designed for students interested in entering the human or veterinary health care industry. <p>202 Computer Music</p> <p align="right">40 - 45 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> Music 190 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Music 150A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a study of the application of contemporary digital technology to the practice of music performance and composition. Emphasis in this course is on acquisition of computer skills to access and manipulate musical data via MIDI, hard disk audio files and other digital formats. These skills allow students to digitally sample sounds, control synthesizers and samplers, access and alter audio files, sequence music, transcribe and print musical scores and conceive new techniques for music composition.
