**233 Kickboxing

Grade Only This course is designed for students to learn kickboxing. It includes solo training, partner training, equipment training, and controlled sparring as practiced by the Kali/Jeet Kune Do family, including JKD kickboxing, the arts of Muay Thai training, Savate, and Panantukan styles of kickboxing. Emphasis is placed on practice in the fundamentals of kickboxing including kickboxing safety skills and etiquette. Grade Only This course examines appraisal principles and procedures for complex properties, emphasizing income producing properties.
