<p>Diesel Technology (DIES)</p> <p>*124 Diesel Engines D 4.00 hours lecture, 9.00 hours lab, 7.00 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: Corequisite: Completion of or concurrent enrollment in DIES 100 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.</p> <p>Students learn the fundamental skills necessary to perform major overhaul operations on Cummins diesel engines. <p>240 Shakespeare 3.00 hours lecture, .00 hours lab, 3.00 units Letter Grade, Student may petition for Credit/No Credit</p> <p>REQUISITES: Prerequisite: ENGL 051 and ENGL 056, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent, or W5/R5. Advisory: ENGL 101 or ENGL 105 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or W6/R6. This course introduces students to William Shakespeare's drama and poetry in a survey of his work, its historical and political context, and its influence on subsequent literature. Students study and analyze representative plays and poems from the perspectives of theme, character, structure, and language, addressing relevant social, political, cultural, and religious issues. Students critically analyze, in essays and other writing assignments, specific works, criticism from his contemporaries to the modern day, interpretations of his works on both stage and screen, and other topics as assigned. <p>309A Emergency Medical Care of the Sick and Injured 1.00 hours lecture, 1.50 hours lab, 1.50 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: None</p> <p>Students learn the emergency medical skills needed by public safety personnel. Topics include emergency care procedures such as examining the victim, observing surroundings, determining case histories, maintaining an airway, performing resuscitation and cardiopulmonary resuscitation, controlling bleeding, and treating cerebrovascular injuries, shock, and seizures. Students also learn about childbirth, manual lifts and carries, and improvising and providing transportation. Proper body alignment, technique, safety, performance and cooperative work with others in the class is emphasized. Students demonstrate increased development of strength, flexibility, and endurance through physical training and intercollegiate athletic contests at San Diego Mesa College.
