<p>100 Fundamentals of Chemistry</p> <p style="text-align: right;">3 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Credit/No Credit Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Corequisite:</i> CHEM 100L. <i>Advisory:</i> ENGL 051 and ENGL 056 and MATH 095 each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level W5/ R5/ M40. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for or concurrent enrollment in CHEM 200. This course is an introductory study of the language and tools of chemistry. Basic concepts of the structure, properties, interactions and changes of matter and energy are studied, both qualitatively and quantitatively. Applications to everyday experiences are considered. <p>Chemistry (CHEM)</p> <p>251 Analytical Chemistry</p> <p style="text-align: right;">3 hours lecture, 6 hours lab, 5 units Letter Grade or Credit/No Credit Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> CHEM 201 and CHEM 201L and MATH 150 each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Advisory:</i> ENGL 101 or ENGL 105 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level R6/W6. This is a course in quantitative analysis. Major topics include theory and practice of gravimetric and volumetric methods of chemical analysis and introduction to instrumental methods of analysis with a focus on precision and accuracy of experimental data. The target audience for Chem 251 is students majoring in chemistry or biochemistry and others who need the course for career advancement. <p>136 History of Canonized Theatre-Ancient Greece to the Restoration</p> <p style="text-align: right;">3 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> ENGL 051 and ENGL 056 each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level W5/ R5. This course is designed to introduce the student to a history theatre of the Western canon from ancient times to the Restoration in England. The student examines the physical theatre and methods of staging drama from the earliest records to the mid-17th Century. Emphasis is placed on text analysis of the works of the canonized playwrights and the relationship of theatre to the historical, political and religious events of the times.
