<p>162 Chemical Dependency Internship Seminar</p> <p align="right">3 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> AODS 156 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Corequisite:</i> AODS 163 or AODS 270. <i>Advisory:</i> AODS 158 and AODS 160 each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for BEHS 162. This course is a study of the nature of chemical dependency treatment with an emphasis on developing the skills and abilities of the student-as-intern. Emphasis is placed on supporting students enrolled in the Chemical Dependency Internship. Throughout this course, students engage in critical analysis of their strengths and weaknesses as interns and as potential professionals in the field. This is a restricted class. This course is open to students only in their final semester within the AODS Certificate Program. <p>*301 Private Pilot Knowledge Test Prep</p> <p align="right">1 hour lecture, 1 unit Credit/No Credit Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> AVIA 101 and AVIA 133 each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> Must have earned a Miramar College Private Pilot Certificate of Completion or must provide proof of eligibility to test for the FAA Private Pilot Knowledge Test. This course offers students the opportunity to review Private Pilot written examination material to prepare for the FAA Private Pilot Knowledge Test. Dramatic Arts (DRAM)

***128 Stage Lighting Design**

**1.5 hours lecture, 4.5 hours lab, 3 units
Letter Grade or Credit/No Credit Option**

REQUISITES:

Prerequisite: DRAM 123 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.
This course is an introduction to the principles and practice of stage lighting through instruction in the design of light plots. Emphasis is placed on design and knowledge of the drafting of lighting plots and the operation of basic electric stage equipment. Students participate in the department production, earning practical experience in lighting and execution. Technical preparation for other forms of production, such as outdoors, television, and movies is included. This course is intended for the transfer student planning a major in Dramatic Arts or desiring competency in technical theater.
