<p>* 120 College Success and Lifelong Learning 3.00 hours lecture, 3.00 units Letter Grade or Credit/No Credit Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 51 and English 56, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent, or Assessment Skill Levels W5 and R5. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Personal Growth 127. This course teaches success strategies to enhance academic and lifelong learning skills. Students explore topics such as motivation and attitudes, values, goal setting, decision-making processes, critical and creative thinking, personal health topics, interpersonal communication, developmental psychology, and learning and personality theories, as well as other techniques for maximizing their abilities to succeed as lifelong learners. <p>* 245 Landscape and Nature Photography 1.50 hours lecture, 4.50 hours lab, 3.00 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> Photography 100 or Photography 105 or Photography 143, with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Photography 265C This course explores the application of film and digital photography in the natural outdoor setting. From images of the "Grand Landscape" to details and abstracts drawn from nature, the class studies effect of light, exposure, composition, concepts of isolation and context, color theory, and various camera shooting techniques along with the work of major landscape and nature photographers. Physical Therapist Assistant (PHYR)

<p>120 Physical Therapy Techniques II 2.00 hours lecture, 6.00 hours lab, 4.00 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> Physical Therapist Assistant 111 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Corequisite:</i> Physical Therapist Assistant 122 and Physical Therapist Assistant 123. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> Special Admission - must be admitted to program. This course is designed for student physical therapist assistants and continuation of Physical Therapy Techniques I with an emphasis on advanced skills and acute care. It explores the use of mechanical traction, electrotherapy and electromagnetic modalities as well as vasopneumatic compression, chest physical therapy, wound care, transfer and transportation of patients, gait techniques for specific diagnoses, and the identification of architectural barriers and basic wheelchair management.
