Varieties of oral expression and interpretation as taken from the Black experience are explored. <p>175 Desktop Publishing Essentials 40 - 45 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent, or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. Computer Business Technology 101 and Multimedia 127 and Art-Fine Art 150B, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course provides students with the skills to create documents that are pre-press and pre-web ready. Students edit texts and graphics to design page layouts, create proposals, newsletters, fliers, brochures, PDF documents, web content and presentations. This course is designed for anyone interested in desktop publishing. <p>100 Introductory Physics</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 54 hours lecture, 48 - 54 hours lab, 4 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> Mathematics 46 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent, or Assessment Skill Level M40. This course is designed for transfer-level students or for those wanting to acquire basic knowledge in physics with a minimum preparation in mathematics. A comprehensive coverage of subject matter in physics is presented, including mechanics, wave motions, thermodynamics, optics, electromagnetism, atomic and nuclear physics. Emphasis is on the conceptual aspects including explanation of natural phenomena.
