<p>* ~190 Cheerleading</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 108 hours lab, 1-2 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> Tryout or Audition. This course provides instruction in cheerleading skills and routines. Proper body alignment, technique, safety, performance and cooperative work with others in the class is emphasized. Students demonstrate increased development of strength, flexibility, and endurance through physical training and practice of cheerleading skills and routines. Students utilize skills learned through the performance of routines at selected intercollegiate athletic contests at Mesa College. This course may be taken four times for credit. <p>165 Theories of Consciousness</p> <p align="right">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 101 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level W6/R6. This course explores various theoretical approaches to the mind-body problem, as well as a broad range of different states of consciousness, including normal waking consciousness, daydreaming, sleeping, dreaming, hypnosis, meditation, and psychedelic drug states. States of consciousness are considered by examining both behavioral experiences as well as neural correlates of those states, including case studies of brain-injured patients and neuroimaging of normal participants in different states of consciousness. <p>* ~170 Javascript Fundamentals for Web Development</p> <p align="right">16 - 18 hours lecture, 48 - 54 hours lab, 2 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> Computer Business Technology 162, Web Development 162 or Web Development 165 and Web Development 168 each, with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a practical study of Javascript and jQuery for Web development. Students use Javascript and jQuery in the Web Page creation process to enhance the user experience. This course is designed for students and professionals who wish to develop skills in Javascript and jQuery.
