<p><b>100 World History I</b></p> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units</b> <b>Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b> <i>Advisory:</i> English 101 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R6 and W6. This course examines the growth of civilizations and the interrelationships of peoples of Europe, Asia, Africa and the Americas from the birth of civilization to the eve of the Modern Era. Topics in social, intellectual, economic, and political history are covered. <p><b>101 World History II</b></p> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units</b> <b>Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</b></p> <p><b>REQUISITES:</b> <i>Advisory:</i> English 101 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level R6/W6. This course examines the comparative history of the world's civilizations in Africa, the Americas, Asia, and Europe from the dawn of the modern era (1600) to the present. Topics in social, intellectual, economic, and political history are covered. 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**Subject: Medical Assisting (MEDA) Discipline: Health Care Ancillaries**

<b>110 Medical Terminology</b>  <b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units</b> <b>Grade Only</b>  <b>REQUISITES:</b> <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. This course covers basic medical terminology and the vocabulary of medical specialties. Special emphasis is on the use of prefixes and suffixes, and non-technical explanations of medical terms and descriptions of anatomy, physiology, and pathology. Students learn to utilize medical terminology as it applies to the structure of the human body, common laboratory tests, radiological and operative procedures, as well as basic pharmacology. 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**Subject: Medical Assisting (MEDA) Discipline: Health Care Ancillaries**

<b>115 Pathophysiology</b>  <b>48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units</b> <b>Grade Only</b>  <b>REQUISITES:</b> <i>Prerequisite:</i> Medical Assisting 55 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Medical Assisting 110 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Biology 160 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. The course focuses on disease processes in the human body from a systems approach. Analysis of the most common and significant diseases is included. The signs and symptoms, etiology, diagnosis, and treatment of disease are examined along with the appropriate medical terminology.
