<p>135 Tree Identification</p> <p style="text-align: right;">24 - 27 hours lecture, 72 - 81 hours lab, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. English 49 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level W5 This field observation course provides students with the opportunity to observe, identify, and discuss a variety of trees used for landscape architectural design in southern California. Emphasis is placed on developing the student's working knowledge of regional tree nomenclature, identification and ecological requirements as they relate to landscape design and landscape management. <p>136 Shrubs, Vines, Groundcover Identification</p> <p style="text-align: right;">24 - 27 hours lecture, 72 - 81 hours lab, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. This field observation course provides students with the opportunity to observe, identify, and discuss shrubs, vines, and groundcovers for landscape architectural design in southern California. Emphasis is placed on developing the student's working knowledge of regional plant nomenclature, identification and ecological requirements as they relate to landscape design and landscape management. <p>190 Environmental Design II: Urban and Community Design 48 - 54 hours lecture, 96 - 108 hours lab, 5 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Architecture 155 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a study of the basic principles of design, composition and design process in the creation of urban and community spaces. Emphasis is placed on involving students in real design projects within the community and developing business communication skills. Participation in job shadowing with an industry professional is required. <p>235 Plants and Design 48 - 54 hours lecture, 96 - 108 hours lab, 5 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Architecture 136 and Architecture 155, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a hands-on study of planting design. Emphasis is placed on the application of historical and contemporary design styles to a variety of environmental conditions. Students design plant combinations to achieve a range of aesthetic, architectural and engineering functions. <p>~365 All Terrain Vehicle Operations - Lifeguards 4 - 6 hours lecture, 12 - 18 hours lab, 0.5 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> Health and Safety. Must be sponsored by a regional lifeguard agency. This course provides training in the operation and responsibilities of All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) used in beach lifeguard operations. Topics include terminology; legal considerations; basic maintenance; riding operations; and pre- and post-operation inspections. <p>101 First Course in German 80 - 90 hours lecture, 5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5 or R5. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for German 100. This entry level course introduces students to the German language and cultures of the German-speaking world. In this interactive course, students learn and use the language by speaking, listening, reading, and writing at the novice level. They also examine and explore basic German language structures and vocabulary. <p>102 Second Course in German</p> <p style="text-align: right;">80 - 90 hours lecture, 5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> German 101 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for German 100. This interactive course is the second in the German language series. Students use increasingly complex German language structures to speak, listen, read, and write in cultural context at the novice-high level. <p>201 Third Course in German</p> <p style="text-align: right;">80 - 90 hours lecture, 5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> German 102 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for German 200. This interactive course is the third in the German language series. Students use increasingly complex language structures and vocabulary to develop the functional competence required to communicate beyond survival needs and to discuss and express opinions on abstract topics related to the arts, lifestyle, linguistics, and literature at the intermediate level. <p>220 Principles of Public Relations</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 101 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Level R6 and W6. This course evaluates public relations as a growing profession. The course looks at the job opportunities for the practitioner, internal and external public relations (PR) and the staff as well as the counselor tasks. It investigates relationships with the media, organizing and executing campaigns. The use of photography, graphics and marketing is also studied. A program of applied learning experiences for students employed in a paralegal-related job or internship under the supervision of an attorney in a law office, government agency, or other legal setting. One unit of credit is earned for each 75 hours of paid employment or 60 hours of volunteer work. The combined maximum credit for all Work Experience courses from all disciplines may not exceed 16 units. <p>100 Logic and Critical Thinking</p> <p style="text-align: right;">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 101 or English 105, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R6 and W6. This course explores the relationship of communications and critical thinking with a focus on good reasoning and impediments to its mastery. It emphasizes the development of skills in logical analysis including familiarity with the more common fallacies.
