<p>118 Lifeguard Training</p> <p align="right">40 - 45 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Physical Education 139. This course is of interest to students who wish to earn the American Red Cross certifications necessary for employment as a lifeguard. This course gives the most current instruction in the American Red Cross lifeguard training techniques and first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation/automated external defibrillation (CPR/AED) skills required to gain eligibility for a lifeguarding position. Upon successful completion, students earn certifications for American Red Cross Lifeguard Training and CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer. Adequate swimming skills are necessary. <p>119 Water Safety Instructor</p> <p align="right">40 - 45 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 3 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Physical Education 164. This course is of interest to students who wish to earn the American Red Cross certifications necessary for employment as a swimming instructor. This course gives the most current instruction in the American Red Cross (ARC) Water Safety Instructor (WSI) course. Upon successful completion, students earn WSI certification, which enables them to teach the Learn to Swim programs of the American Red Cross. Adequate swimming skills are necessary at the Learn to Swim Level 4. <p>*~ 130A Indoor Cycling I</p> <p style="text-align: right;">32 - 54 hours lab, 0.5-1 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5. This course is the first in a series of Indoor Cycling courses. This course provides instruction in the basic fundamentals necessary to improve indoor cycling techniques and improve cardiovascular/aerobic fitness. Topics includes cycling terminology and ergonomics, overall fitness evaluation, various indoor cycling exercise regimens, and goal setting programs for individual health and fitness benefits. <p>*~ 130B Indoor Cycling II</p> <p align="right">32 - 54 hours lab, 0.5-1 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Exercise Science 130A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is the second in a series of Indoor Cycling courses. Emphasis is based on beginning to intermediate cycling techniques, heart rate calculations, fitness evaluations, and cardiovascular training and program design. Beginning level principles of physiology are explored including how to train to elicit a desired physiological response. <p>201 Third Course In French</p> <p align="right">80 - 90 hours lecture, 5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> French 102 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or three years of high school French. This is an intermediate course in French. Language structures and vocabulary for communication are examined and explored through speaking, listening, reading and writing at the intermediate level. Students explore in more depth than in previous courses the history and the culture of the French-speaking world. Subject: French (FREN) Discipline: Foreign Languages

<p>202 Fourth Course in French</p> <p align="right">80 - 90 hours lecture, 5 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> French 201 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or four years of high school French. This is an advanced-intermediate course and is the fourth course in the French language sequence. In this interactive course, language structures and vocabulary for communication are examined and studied through speaking, listening, reading and writing at the high-intermediate level. Students continue to explore the history and the culture of the French-speaking world. Readings of literary and culturally relevant authentic materials are examined in depth. <p>~210 Conversation and Composition in French I</p> <p align="right">48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> French 102 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent Or successful completion of three years of high school French. This course further develops oral comprehension and fluency as well as written communication at a mid-intermediate level in French through culturally relevant materials. Students develop spoken and written vocabulary, dramatize everyday topics of conversation, interpret and describe materials, and compare and contrast the cultures of the French speaking world with U.S. culture both orally and in writing. Writing strategies are emphasized and literature is introduced. <p>~211 Conversation and Composition French II 48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> French 210 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course develops oral comprehension and fluency as well as written proficiency in French at an advanced-intermediate level through reading, analyzing, discussing, and reporting on culturally relevant materials. Students develop oral and reading vocabulary skills, study the cultures of the French-speaking world, and further develop the reading strategies introduced in French 210 through reading literature. <p>56 Administrative Medical Assisting I 16 - 18 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 1.5 units Grade Only</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 47A or English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Medical Assisting 110 with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. <i>Limitation on Enrollment:</i> This course is not open to students with previous credit for Medical Assisting 66 or Medical Assisting 104. Special Admission - must be admitted to program. This course is designed to prepare Allied Health students to work in physicians' offices, clinics, hospitals, and other medical areas. <p>*~ 101 Music History I: Middle Ages to Mid 18th Century 48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Music 150A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a study of Western (European) music from the Middle Ages through the middle of the 18th century. Emphasis is on aural and visual recognition of style, form, and other musical elements, examined through representative works of composers of each historical period. <p>*~ 102 Music History II: Mid 18th - Early 20th Century 48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> English 48 and English 49, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent or Assessment Skill Levels R5 and W5; Music 150A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This course is a study of Western (European) music from the middle of the 18th century through the early 20th century. Emphasis is on aural and visual recognition of style, form, and other musical elements examined through representative works of major composers of each historical period. <p>~132A Classical Guitar I</p> <p align="center">8 - 9 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 1 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Advisory:</i> Music 150A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This is the first of a two-semester sequence of courses that present the study of classical guitar. The beginning course introduces basic skills to students who have had little or no experience with the guitar. This course focuses on developing right and left-hand technique and sight-reading. Lectures are followed by practical application on the instrument. The course is intended for students who are interested in learning the fundamentals of classical guitar and elementary music skills.</p> <p>FIELD TRIP REQUIREMENTS: May be required</p> <p>TRANSFER APPLICABILITY: Associate Degree Credit & transfer to CSU. <p>~132B Classical Guitar II</p> <p align="center">8 - 9 hours lecture, 24 - 27 hours lab, 1 units Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option</p> <p>REQUISITES: <i>Prerequisite:</i> Music 132A with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent. This is the second in a two-semester sequence of study of classical guitar. In this course students are introduced to a set of broad-ranging technical skills including mastery of the fretboard, chord chart reading, and sight-reading. This course also introduces level-appropriate literature, including works from several periods and styles, with an emphasis on interpretation skills. Lectures are followed by practical application on the instrument. Students apply the skills and techniques developed in this class in live performances. This course is intended for students who are interested in learning classical guitar and music skills.</p> <p>FIELD TRIP REQUIREMENTS: May be required</p> <p>TRANSFER APPLICABILITY: Associate Degree Credit & transfer to CSU.
