1. Art History AP exam: Duane Short

Miramar is waiting to have a full time art historian to make their recommendation; City is ok with changing the wording to "and" to clear both courses; Juliette will consult with faculty at her campus.

Mesa's faculty response provided by Juliette via email 05/12/14: After research/review by our Art Department, the recommendation is to stay with the current award in fulfilling major requirements (SDCCD: ARFT 110 <u>or</u> ARTF 111).

Reason: "students may not receive the full content of both courses and also there is a lot of variation from high school to high school on the level of rigor for the AP Art History course. The AP students should take one of the two core courses at Mesa (or another college in the district)."

New Business

2. CCCCO new requirements for ADT degrees and C-ID: Shelly Hess There has been conflicting information about the courses that need to be submitted for C-ID approval; whether only the courses included in the core and list A need to be submitted or all of the courses included in the ADT degree. Articulation Officers and Shelly explained the colleges have been following the PCAH guidelines and only courses included in the core and list A have been submitted to C-ID.
