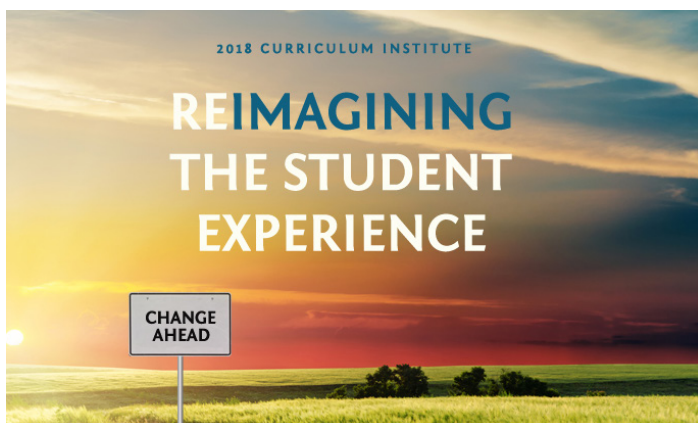

2018 Curriculum Institute

In July, curriculum chairs, articulation officers, classified professionals, and administrators from San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges, San Diego Continuing Education, and the SDCCD District Offices attended the 2018 Curriculum Institute, "Reimagining the Student Experience." The Board of Governors Approved Changes to Title 5 §55070 Credit Certificates

The State Chancellor's Office has notified community colleges of changes to Title 5 regarding credit certificates. Highlights of the changes to Title 5, §55070 Credit Certificates, effective August 23, 2018, are as follows:

- 1) **§55070(a)**
The minimum units for high-unit credit certificates will change from 18 or more semester units to 16 or more semester units. This change is consistent with federal regulations for financial aid as students are eligible for financial aid with a minimum of 16 semester units.
- 2) **§55070(c)**
The minimum units for low-unit credit certificates will change from a minimum of 12 semester units and fewer than 18 semester units to a minimum of eight semester units and fewer than 16 semester units. This change allows for more low-unit certificates of achievement to be eligible for identification on student transcripts.

Military Education program attends NDIA Navy Gold Coast Event

The San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) Military Education program attended the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA) Navy Gold Coast Event at the San Diego Convention Center from August 6th through August 9th. The Navy Gold Coast Event is a Navy procurement conference which provides an opportunity to assist businesses that seek to provide contract solutions to the Department of the Navy. The SDCCD Military Education program was able to network with like-minded organizations which provide education and training solutions to the Navy. Discussions were focused on the program's current and previous experience and how the capabilities and resources of our organization can be leveraged for future Navy contract opportunities.

Perkins Reauthorized

After twelve years, the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act (Perkins) has been reauthorized. With this new reauthorization comes a new name: *Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act* (Perkins V).

The Carl Perkins Act was first authorized by Congress in 1984 with the express goal of providing individuals with the academic and technical knowledge and skills they need to prepare for careers in current or emerging employment sectors. The Perkins program was last reauthorized in 2006.

The Act provides almost \$1.3 billion in federal support for career and technical education programs in all 50 States, including support for integrated career pathways programs. Perkins is critical to ensuring that SDCCD Career Education programs are prepared to meet the ever-changing needs of learners and employers.

The new law includes new requirements for "programs of study" that link academic and technical content across secondary and post-secondary education, and strengthened local accountability provisions that support continuous program improvement.

Perkins V will take effect in July 2019.

CTE Transitions Credit by Exam

As of August 2018, the CTE Transitions program has processed over 2,000 student petitions for college credit from the San Diego Unified School District. This is a 361% increase from the previous year and a 623% increase from 2015-2016.

During the 2017-2018 academic year, 17 Credit by Exam agreements were in place for CTE Transitions between San Diego Unified School District and San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges. Additionally, Credit by Exam agreements exist between SDCCD and Escondido Union School District, Vista Unified School District, Poway Unified School District, Carlsbad Unified School District, and Sweetwater Union High

School District. Over 4,000 high school students across 36 high school sites participated in these CTE Transitions Credit by Exam approved courses. Over 2,800 students were eligible to receive college credit, and about 2,100 (75%) have petitioned for this credit so far. Since students have 18 months from the time of their graduation to request this credit, this number is expected to increase.
