## Industry Advisors Play a Critical Role in Career Education Programs

On October 30, the SDCCCD held the fifth annual Board of Trustees Industry Advisory Committee Member Appreciation event honoring more than 60 industry advisors engaged in career education programs at San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges and San Diego Continuing Education.

Career education programs have advisory committees with representatives from business and industry. Advisory committees meet regularly and engage in discussion regarding workforce needs, skills and competencies, and program design.

Through these career education advisory committees, the district's institutions engage with over 1,000 industry advisors annually.

The Board of Trustees event was to thank industry advisors for their voluntary service and dedication to helping to ensure SDCCCD career education programs are aligned with industry need.

## California Community College Chancellor's Office Curriculum Updates

In an effort to streamline the curriculum approval process, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office in consultation with the California Community Colleges Curriculum Committee (5C), has revised the following processes:

- Substantial and Nonsubstantial Changes to Degrees and Certificates including IGETC and CSU GE Certificates;
- Modifications to title 5, Section 55070: Credit Certificates;
- Cooperative Work Experience.

## PATH Presentation at CUNY

UC San Diego transfer students Arielle Amante and Kelly Clemen, SDCCD Faculty Jennifer Derillo, Rodrigo Gomez, and Pegah Motaleb, and UC San Diego Program Manager Laura Martin presented at the [2018 Humanities Alliance Conference](#) hosted by the City University of New York (CUNY). The presentation, "*Articulating the Discord: How San Diego's PATH is Attempting to De-Instrumentalize Education*," addressed PATH's vision and goals to emphasize the foundational, transferable, and enduring role of the Humanities. In addition, they shared creative solutions for humanities transfer-bound students in the San Diego Community College District: the Peer Mentee Program, joint collaborative meetings, a four-week transfer summer academy, and student stipends. They also talked about the importance of the humanities in the 21st century, focusing on technology, social media, public speaking, visual monologue techniques, and storytelling.



## Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC)

San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges participate in the Child Development Training Consortium's educational support stipend program for students studying and working in the Child Development field. Eligible students must be working within the childcare profession and attending college at the same time.

Scholarship funding is provided by the California Department of Education Early Education and Support Division through the Yosemite Community College District.

CDTC funding supports student completion of college coursework, certificates of achievement, and associate in science degrees, as well as pursuit of Child Development permits at multiple levels, from Assistant Teacher to Program Director, which are required for advancement in the field. Students may apply for funds to cover the cost of permit applications, tuition, books, and supplies.

For the 2017-2018 program year, fifty-one SDCCD students received grants ranging from \$25 to \$1,019. A total of \$12,500 was awarded.



## Title 5 Changes

The California Community Colleges Board of Governors approved the following California Code of Regulations, title 5 changes:

### 1) Title 5, Distance Education Regulations §§ 55200 – 55210

The title 5 distance education sections were modified to include technical and procedural modifications and non-substantive updates for clarity and consistency. Section 55204. Instructor Contact, was to be modified to add that distance education courses include regular and substantive interaction “among students.”

### 2) Title 5, § 58170. Apportionment for Tutoring

The tutoring regulations were modified to enable students to self-refer to “Supervised Tutoring” courses on the basis of a learning need. [Click here](#) for additional details.

### 3) Title 5, § 55800. Annual Report to Chancellor

Title 5 requires the governing board of each community college to report to the Chancellor on the condition of district libraries for the preceding fiscal year also known as the ALDS report. The California Community Colleges Board of Governors approved to change the due for this report from August 31 of each year to October 31. [Click here](#) for additional details.

## SB 1071 Policy to Award Credit for Prior Military Education, Training, and Service

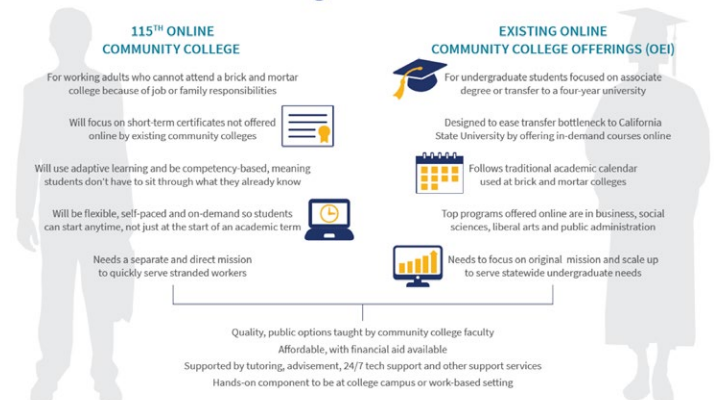
In September, the Governor approved SB 1071. This senate bill requires the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, in collaboration with the Academic Senate for the California Community Colleges, to begin development of a uniform policy to award military personnel and veterans who have an official Joint Services Transcript appropriate course credit. The bill requires the policy to be developed by September 2019. Colleges must adopt a similar policy by December 31, 2020.

ACME consists of established State Advisory Councils on Military Education, committed to addressing military education issues within their respective states.

ACME focuses its efforts on main topics such as evaluating and restructuring policies related to acceptance and transfer of credit for veterans, military students, and their family members; enhancing the educational aspirations of the military populations in the state; and making educational programs accessible in cost, location, and scheduling.
