

## 2020-21 SDCCE Launchboard Summary College of Continuing Education

College of Continuing Education May 30, 2023

## Context

This briefing contains a summary of CTE data for the College of Continuing Education students from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) CAL-PASS Plus Launchboard (data in dashboard under "San Diego Adult"). Data is from 2020-21 (the most recent available data) unless otherwise noted.

The <u>Community College Pipeline</u> dashboard is part of the CCCO Launchboard suite of reporting tools. This dashboard shows data collected from California community colleges' MIS submissions. By selecting a district or college, users can show data for students enrolled CTE and those not enrolled in CTE courses. Further disaggregations by those enrolled in CTE courses are available by CTE Sector and TOP code. Data is generally available with a two-year reporting lag; i.e., the most recent available data as of the production of this report (5/30/23) is for the 2020-21 academic year.

This summary compares outcomes for SDCCE students enrolled in CTE courses to those not enrolled in CTE courses.

**Demographic data** for these two groups is compared across the following disaggregations:

This data is intended to inform conversations about the CTE student population and program outcomes. It should be noted that SDCCD data for the 2020-21 academic year reflects coursework taken nearly entirely online – the district transitioned nearly all instruction online for that academic year. Further student- and course-level data is available in the 2020-21 CTE Biennial Briefing (Part 1 and Part 2). An updated version of that report will be available in August 2023.




Figure 1. % Students Became Employed after Exiting College, SDCCE
