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1. Collaborative and create partnerships with faculty, counselors and students to create a comprehensive approach to student completion goals.
2. Provide a wide range of no-cost services to students looking to build career and leadership skills, further academic studies, find and capture employment opportunities, and develop personally and professionally through various wrap-around services.
3. Build an alumni association in which we provide opportunities and assistance after graduation for employment or continuing education and well as pathways to mentorship for current students.
4. Build collaborative partnerships with employers in San Diego in which students are able to obtain employment in their chosen career pathways that provides living wage opportunities.

# Career and College Transition – What we do...

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## Employer Spotlight

- Spotlight events provide benefits for SDCE students while increasing recognition and affinity for our partner organizations. Students from all seven campuses are invited to attend and hear about employers and what they can do to be a part of it. Employer spotlights have transitioned seamlessly to a remote environment with both employers and students reporting positive outcomes.

## Virtual Employer Mixers

- Employer mixers provide benefit to SDCE students by bringing a host of employers in the same industry pathway to provide in-depth conversations about their companies, hiring practices and what a student needs to do to become employed.

## Virtual Employer Interviews

- Interviews benefit SDCE students by bringing the employer to them. In this process, students are able to meet directly with employers and participate in on the spot interviews.

## Virtual Employer Classroom Presentations

- Classroom presentations bring value to SDCE students and faculty as employers can discuss their companies trends, educational requirements, company culture, hiring process benefits, compensation and career pathways.

# Career and College Transition – What we do...

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## Mock Interviews

- Provide students with the skills needed to be successful in interviewing for employment. Mock interviews are held through a zoom platform in which we record them so that students have an opportunity to review.

## Resume/Interview/Soft Skills Workshops

- Provide students with the tools and assistance needed to support them in achieving employment.

## Career Counseling and Coaching

- Provide student with the skills to explore careers or choose an educational pathway leading to a career. Students are able to take various career assessments and work one-on-one with a dedicated career counselor or job placement coordinator.



# Career and College Transition – What we do...

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## Hiring Events

C&CT offers two types of hiring events for employer engagement.

- Industry specific which provides students with the opportunity to learn about job openings, complete applications and participate in on the spot interviews in their **chosen** career pathway.
- All pathway hiring events are those in which we invite employers from all of the career pathways as well as employers who can provide necessity jobs for students. In these hiring events students have an opportunity to meet with hiring personnel, learn about job openings and submit resumes or applications for interested positions.

## Internship

- Internships provide a cost-effective way to prepare tomorrow's workforce, build skills specific to employer organizations, provide students with hands-on experience in their chosen career pathway and open opportunities for student employment.

## Outreach & Information Sessions

- Employers seeking interns, part-time hires, or full-time career professionals may schedule outreach dates. We will sponsor any employer or organization who wants to promote internships, part-time positions or career opportunities. Staffing agencies are also welcome. Employers must provide a contact name, website, phone number, e-mail address, and business location that students may be referred to for follow up.
