Data Engagement Updates

Reminder provided regarding the three focus areas committee members identified:

- 1. Support Data Informed Decision Making
- 2. Share existing reports and research
- 3. Increase shared understanding and insight into shared customers/students (Priority focus for 2022-23)

The Workforce Partnership / SDCCD Data sharing MOU has been renewed. Term based data exchange continues.

Shared Customers/Students – The Concurrent Enrollment Dashboard

The 2022-23 priority focus of data engagement efforts has been on our "shared customers/students" – individuals who are both enrolled in one or more courses at one or more SDCCD colleges and receiving services from the Workforce Partnership.

- Chris Cruzcosa, Data Analyst Manager, Workforce Partnership and Melinda Jackson, Data Analyst, Workforce Partnership, presented the new Dashboard
 - o Access to the Dashboard
 - Key definitions:
 - Concurrent specific to a single term; enrolled in one or more courses at one or more SDCCD colleges and (in the same term) enrolled in an Workforce Partnership WIOA service
 - Noncurrent has some sort of record with SDCCD and received an SDWP services at some point in time

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• Overarching Observations

- The following for key observations were presented:
 - 1. More people are concurrent than not
 - a. If they are enrolled in one it is a good time to talk about enrolling in the other
 - b. May inform referral efforts
 - c. Referrals may be more successful if done early in the process rather than later or near the end of the services provided
 - 2. Older adults are making more than youth
 - a. May just be because older adults have more prior work experience
 - b. May mean we need to rethink program design and job placements for youth
 - 3. Wages vary across colleges and services
 - a. College of Continuing Education shows \$2 more than the other colleges
 - b. Median wage insights were explored and presented; some programs have higher wages (Dislocated Worker \$22, National Dislocated \$20, and Apprenticeship \$19.61), while clear gaps remain for other areas and populations (American Indian less than \$15);
 - 4. Overall populations served is declining
- Interests, observations, and questions expressed by meeting participants:
 - Interested expressed in exploring concurrently enrolled students who are not yet placed or unemployed
 - Continuing Education expressed interest in leveraging the shared data infrastructure to support their required reporting for WIOA II programs
 - Action: Marc and Kelly to meet to review needs
 - How can we utilize the information to partner on outreach and employment services?
 - What interest/trends can we gleam from the dashboard to inform services?
 - How can we use the dashboard information to help prioritize our highest need populations?
 - How can we use the information to inform cross training
 - How can we connect applicable course recommendations (or college program recs) to certain Workforce Partnership programs?
 - Explored courses taken by different programs and populations (example: when looking at dislocated worker students are enrolled in skill builder courses)
 - Meeting participants expressed in using the dashboard to inform action/next steps
 - Action needed: meeting participants to review the concurrent enrollment dashboard internally and consider what action to take based on the information provided
 - Colleges to share update during the June meeting.

- Explore whether or not we can add if folks are English language learners
- Explore whether or not we can add education level
- Next Steps Over the summer, 2022-23 program year data will be added to the dashboard
