Description

The San Diego Community College District serves approximately 100,000 students each semester through three two-year colleges and six continuing education campuses. The three colleges - San Diego City College, San Diego Mesa College and San Diego Miramar College - offer associate degrees and certificates in occupational programs that prepare students for entry-level jobs, and arts and sciences programs that transfer to four-year colleges and universities.

The Continuing Education Campuses offer adults the opportunity to renew their learning experiences through noncredit vocational, basic skills, life skills, and enrichment classes at sites throughout the city. A number of special programs are unique to the city, including KSDS-FM all-jazz radio, the Center for Competitive and Applied Technologies, and the Workplace Learning Resource Center.

The San Diego Community College District is governed by its five-member, locally elected Board of Trustees and three student members serving on a rotating basis. Shared governance activities involve faculty, students and staff in the development of solutions to key policy and budget issues. The five trustees are elected in even-numbered years to four-year terms by the voters of San Diego. The Chancellor, the District's chief executive officer, is responsible for carrying out the policies approved by the Board of Trustees.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

1) Districtwide: Pursue LEED certification for all projects based on District Policy.

2) District Office: Seismic upgrade and remodel of the District Office will be complete by September 2008.

3) District Service Center: Mesquita and Associates has been hired to design the remodel of the recently acquired property to house maintenance facility operations.

Urban, multicultural San Diego City College welcomes more than 16,000 students every semester to its beautiful 60-acre campus. As the educational cornerstone of downtown San Diego, the tree-lined campus is a short walk from the bustling Gaslamp Quarter, Balboa Park, PETCO Park, and San Diego Bay. With more than 100 majors, 115 certificate programs, and 1,500 classes, City graduates are employed throughout our community as nurses, journalists, electricians, cosmetologists, youth development workers, fitness specialists, counselors, machine techs, and radio/TV broadcasters. Additionally, our vibrant Visual and Performing Arts department offers theatre, dance, music, fine art, graphic design and photography. Exceptional student support services and excellence in education for more than 94 years keeps City College as the number one choice for a quality education.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

- 1) Harry West Gym: New lighting and skylights will be installed.
- 2) L Building (Academic Success Building): The renovation is scheduled to be completed in March 2009 and will house Tutoring, Math and English Centers, Trio/Aspire, New Horizons, MESA, Puente, Umoja, EOPS, CalWORKs, City Middle College, Assessment, Title V, Advising, and General Classrooms.
- 3) Career Technology Center: Construction is scheduled to start in early June and should be completed by December 2009. The CTC Building will house Cosmetology, Photography, Nursing and the College Police headquarters for City College.
- 4) P Building: Jaynes Corporation is renovating the existing building that will then provide offices, team rooms, lockers, weight room and classroom space for the exercise science department.

Description

Among the largest community colleges in California and the nation, San Diego Mesa College is a fullyaccredited two-year college offering 160 Associate degree and certificate programs. Recognized in 2007 as one of the top 100 producers of associate degrees in the nation, Mesa ranks as San Diego's top transfer institution. The college also serves as an important economic catalyst for the region. Its career programs and industry alliances offer graduates almost immediate job placement in the fields of allied health, biopharmaceutical, biotechnology, business technology, consumer studies, and more. Other top specialized career programs include fashion, architecture, multimedia, animal health technology, American Sign Language, interior design, and hospitality and event management. Situated on a sprawling, suburban 104 acre campus in Kearny Mesa, the college's small classes, outstanding faculty, and reputation for quality offer an unparalleled academic experience.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

- 1) LRC, P-100 and R-100: Fire alarms will be replaced and the LRC café will be remodeled.
- 2) East Campus Road Realignment, Parking Structure and Police Facility Projects: The road and parking structure portions will be completed by March 2009. The Police Facility will be completed by May 2009.
- 3) All Weather Track and Football Field Project: A design firm has been selected and construction is anticipated to start in March 2009 with completion by September 2009.
- 4) Allied Health Building and East Campus Phase 3 Road Realignment Projects: Construction started in May 2008 with all construction to be complete by December 2009.
- 5) Math/Science Building: A new building to house the math and science departments is being designed.
- 6) Student Services: A new building to house student services is in design.

Description

San Diego Continuing Education is one of the oldest and largest noncredit institutions in the nation. It is also the only California community college continuing education entity separately accredited to the high standard of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Continuing Education serves approximately 100,000 students each year with more than 4,000 class offerings through 6 campuses and 300 community sites. It offers Certificates of Competencies, which enhance income and employment potential, building a strong workforce. Because of higher education system reimbursement, Continuing Education is able to offer classes free of charge to students.

Definition of Terms San Diego Community College District

Annual Unduplicated Headcount: This information is not provided for individual colleges due to the high level of cross-enrollment from term to term (i.e., students whose primary college of enrollment changes from term to term).

Headcount by Term (Unduplicated within Terms): This is based on students actively enrolled in a specific term (Summer, Fall, Winter, or Spring terms). This headcount includes both credit and noncredit students. A student is counted only once in each term in which the student is actively enrolled. However, if the student is enrolled in more than one term during the period being discussed, the student will be counted for each term.

Example: A student enrolled in Fall 2007 and Spring 2008. For the Annual Unduplicated Headcount, the student will be counted once. For the Student Headcount by Term, the student will be counted once in each term.

Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES): FTES is the major student workload measure, one of several, used in determining the eligibility for state funding of community colleges. The FTES does not reflect "headcount enrollment". It is the equivalent of 525 hours of student instruction per each FTES. FTES is derived by considering that one student could be enrolled in courses for 3 hours a day, 5 days a week, for an academic year of 35 weeks- a total of 525 hours per one FTES.
