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

The three credit colleges in San Diego, City College, Mesa College and Miramar College, serve approximately 60,000 students both locally and at a distance. The colleges offer associate degrees in arts and sciences that transfer to four-year institutions, as well as certificates in professional occupational programs. A number of programs are unique to the San Diego region, including the Center for Competitive and Applied Technologies, the Southern California Biotechnology Center, the San Diego Regional Public Safety Training Institute, the Workplace Learning Resource Center, KSDS-FM all-jazz radio station, and the Accelerated College Program (taught at area high schools).

Nearly 45,000 students enroll in noncredit classes at seven San Diego Continuing Education (CE) campuses and 109 community facilities throughout the city. Local residents enroll in more than 3,500 classes including classes for the G.E.D. program, English as a Second Language, and career/job training programs. Continuing Education also offers adults the opportunity to renew their learning experiences through noncredit vocational, basic skills, life skills, and enrichment classes.

SDCCD is governed by its five-member, locally elected Board of Trustees and three student members serving on a rotating basis. Shared governance activities involve faculty, students, and staff in the development of solutions to key policy and budget issues. The trustees are elected in even-numbered years to four-year terms by the voters of San Diego. The Chancellor, the District's chief executive officer, is responsible for carrying out the policies approved by the Board of Trustees.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

The District continues to divert a significantly higher percentage of its waste stream than the 50% required by legislation – an average of 80% across all campuses and the District Offices.

The District also continues to generate significant amounts of solar energy – more than 10 million kilowatt-hours to date. In doing so, the District is able to earn Renewable Energy Credits (REC) – one credit for every megawatt-hour (MWh) of renewable energy delivered to the local power grid. By reducing generation of carbon dioxide (CO₂), the District is also earning Carbon Offset Credits (COC) – one credit for every metric ton of CO₂ reduced.

The District also began implementing Smart Meeting, which measures electricity usage multiple times per day, providing meaningful information about when and where energy consumption is at its highest.

As the first community college in San Diego and the fifth in California, San Diego City College has educated more than 1,000,000 students in its 100-year history. Celebrating its Centennial in 2014, City College was ranked #1 of the top 25 community colleges in the nation in a recent RateMyProfessors.com annual report. The 60-acre City College campus is a short walk from the City College Trolley Station, world-renown Balboa Park, the bustling Gaslamp Quarter, PETCO Park, and San Diego Bay. The multicultural campus is home to approximately 17,000 students each semester and offers more than 250 degrees and certificate programs and nearly 1,500 classes. City College nursing graduates work in every major health care facility in San Diego County and alumni are employed throughout the region as cosmetologists, journalists, fitness specialists, counselors, archaeologists, and radio/TV broadcasters. City College also offers Career-Technical/Vocational training for in-demand fields such as environmental control technology, biotechnology, computer information systems, machine technology, and shipbuilding technology. Leaders in innovation, City College was the first college to start a Sustainable Urban Agriculture program in San Diego County and its Seeds@City Farm serves as an outdoor classroom and Farmer's Market. The Institute for Human Development opens doors into the community through its Community Health Work, Youth Development Work, Mental Health Work, Peace Studies, and Futures Studies programs. Additionally, the vibrant Visual and Performing Arts department offers theater, dance, music, fine art, and award-winning graphic design and photography programs. Offering exceptional student support services and excellence in education for 100 years, City College remains a number one choice for a quality education.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

In 2012-2013, the new Mathematics and Social Sciences (MS) Building was completed and is expected to be awarded LEED Silver certification. Construction on the Science Building is expected to be completed by the end of summer 2013 and is on track for a LEED Silver certification. Construction for the Arts & Humanities and Business Technology Buildings will continue and are slated for completion at the end of 2013. Designs for the C and M Buildings were submitted to the Division of the State Architect for approval. Design and programming continued for the A, D, and T Building renovations.

San Diego Miramar College, located in the fast-growing Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch suburban area of San Diego along the I-15 corridor, offers 149 certificates, associate degrees, and comprehensive transfer programs to students transferring to UC, CSU, and private institutions. The College serves approximately 18,000 students annually and is one of the fastest growing colleges within San Diego County. Partnerships with local industry and the City and County of San Diego help San Diego Miramar College prepare students for high demand and well-paying careers in the highly competitive labor market, including biotechnology, paralegal, aviation, automotive, diesel, and alternative fuels technologies. San Diego Miramar College is home to the Southern California Biotechnology Center, Advanced Transportation and Energy Center, and San Diego Regional Public Safety Institute. Since 1969, the college has provided training for nearly all law enforcement officers and firefighters within San Diego County. The Institute also trains EMTs and offers the only open water lifeguard degree program in the world. State-of-the-art science, automotive, heavy duty advanced transportation, fitness/athletics/health, humanities/arts and business/math classroom buildings, and a 100,000 square foot library/learning resources center and student union are among major facilities recently completed to meet the comprehensive instructional and student service needs of its growing student body.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

In 2012-2013, renovations of the Aviation Technology Center and the Heavy Duty Advanced Transportation Technology Center were completed, along with construction of the new College Service Center and the Cafeteria/Bookstore/Student Services Center. All four facilities are on track to obtain LEED Silver certifications. Numerous infrastructure upgrades were completed.

Designs were submitted to the Division of the State Architect (DSA) for the expansion of the Science Building, the remodel of the A-100 building, and for the renovation of the Interim Library into a new student welcome center. Designs for the new Administration Building and the Fire Science/EMT Training Facility were approved; construction started in summer 2013. Programming and design continued for the expansion of the maintenance facilities and for the remodel of the existing Police Academy.

San Diego Continuing Education (SDCE) is the adult education division of SDCCD. Nearly 45,000 students are served each academic year at seven main campuses and many community locations. Continuing Education is one of the oldest and largest non-credit institutions in the nation, serving San Diegans since 1914. Students are among the most diverse in California—culturally, ethnically, and educationally.

Non-credit classes are offered at no cost, and students who enroll in classes have a variety of educational and personal goals. Programs address essential areas of adult education including short-term job training, career development, English as a Second Language, adult basic skills, an Emeritus program for age 55+, parenting, and Disability Support Programs and Services. Additionally, San Diego Continuing Education offers low fee classes for professional and personal enrichment.

SDCE was one of the first non-credit institutions in the U.S. to be separately accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). The administrators, faculty, and staff are highly qualified with many holding master's degrees and several holding doctoral degrees.

Major Construction Projects/Improvements Underway or Planned for the Year

In 2012-2013, the expansion of the Educational Cultural Complex (ECC) was completed to include a new administration wing, a new classroom wing, the renovation of the previous administration wing, and new parking. The project is expected to be awarded a LEED Silver certification.

Construction of the new North City Campus was completed; the facility is on track to obtain a LEED Gold certification. The Coastal Development permit was approved for the consolidation of the Centre City and Cesar E. Chavez facilities; construction of the new building is underway and is expected to be completed in March 2015. The project is on track for a LEED Silver certification. Design work for an adjacent parking structure is underway.

The total number of students who transferred to a 4-year institution and were enrolled at an SDCCD college at any time within three semesters prior to transferring (including stop outs). The student must also have completed 12 or more transferrable units from any one of the SDCCD credit colleges within six years prior to transferring to a 4-year institution.
