## **Executive Summary**

### **Introduction**

In order to obtain data about why students do not return to San Diego Community College District's three colleges prior to degree attainment or completion of educational goals, SDCCD's Office of Institutional Research began a two-part retention study during the Fall 2000 semester. This is part two of the study.

The first part of the study focused on three groups of students: those who applied but did not enroll, dropped before census, and those who withdrew after census. This part of the retention report focuses on two populations: students who were disqualified Fall 2000, and students who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001.

The purpose of this study is to provide a thorough analysis of these two groups so administrators and policymakers may be more informed in their efforts to develop outreach or retention activities.

Each group was analyzed in three ways:

1. Demographic analysis: Provides a demographic profile of each group. Included in the analysis are ethnicity, educational objective, GPA, and other variables.
2. Prediction study: Identifies factors, if any, which can predict student behaviors or tendencies.
3. Survey analysis: A sample of each population was surveyed to identify reasons for not successfully matriculating.

### **Summary of Findings**

#### **Group 1: Students who were disqualified**

The following differences in demographics were found between students who were disqualified when compared to the general student population.

- At Miramar a greater proportion of Filipino students were disqualified than the general student population (23.9% versus 11.4%). At City, a greater proportion of African American students were disqualified compared to the percent of African Americans in the student population (30.1% versus 16.3%).

- There is a smaller proportion of students who were disqualified that work 40 or more hours per week than the SDCCD population (18.9% versus 30.4%).
- There is a greater proportion of students between the ages of 19 and 21 that were disqualified compared to SDCCD population (38.9% versus 22.3%).
- All colleges had more students who were disqualified that earned less than 30 cumulative units.

Following are some key findings from the survey sent to 1,962 students who were disqualified. Only 193 responded, yielding a response rate of 7.1%. Since the response rate is low, these results should be used with caution.

- Respondents from all colleges stated that the district could have helped by having a more flexible course schedule, more financial aid, and if instructors were more flexible with grading.
- At Miramar, students indicated that more career oriented programs and more study skills classes would have helped.
- Respondents at Mesa indicated that more counseling services and more career oriented programs would have helped them succeed.
- City respondents indicated that more counseling services, more study skills classes, and longer computer lab hours would have helped.
- The majority of students who were disqualified responded that they spent 1 – 10 hours per week studying outside of class.

## **Group 2: Students who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001**

The following differences in demographics were found among students who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001 and the general population.

- Fewer first time students did not persist than the SDCCD population (23.5% compared to 32.8%). At City, 46.4% of students who did not persist were first time transfer students compared to 34.1% of the population.
- 52.5% of students who did not persist were enrolled in fewer than 5 units in Fall 2000 compared to 35.5% of the population.

Following are some key findings from the survey sent to 5,000 students who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001. There were 515 respondents, yielding a response rate of 10.3%.

- The primary reasons students did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001 were: transferred to another school, conflict with work schedule, and course scheduling problem.
- At City, personal reasons was also a top reason. At Mesa, completed degree or certificate was a top reason. At Miramar, dissatisfaction with prior instructor was a top reason, in addition to completed educational goals.

### **Observations and Recommendations**

This retention research generates valuable information for creating efficient and effective strategies to increase student retention in the District. Based on research findings and student comments, it is recommended that SDCCD implement the following retention practices:

- Offer shorter semester terms and more flexible course schedules.
- Offer more online classes and online registration.
- Help students improve study skills.
- Increase parking capacity on campus.
- Have counseling services more accessible to students.
- Offer more career oriented programs.

Institutional Research will continue to conduct analysis of these groups in order to increase retention outcomes; including successful class completion, degree attainment, and successful matriculation.

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# INTRODUCTION

## BACKGROUND

This is the second part of the Retention report exploring reasons why students did not continue their education with SDCCD beyond Fall 2000. The first report, produced in May 2001, examined three groups: students who applied but did not enroll, students who dropped before census, and students who withdrew from all classes after census during the Fall 2000 term. This report will examine two additional groups of students: Those who were disqualified for academic reasons, and those who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001. Table 1 shows the number of students in each group for each college.

## RESEARCH STUDIES

The report is divided by the two groups described above. Three studies were done for each group: Demographic analysis, prediction study, and survey analysis. The fourth section looks at course success rates by subject.

### Part I: Demographic Analysis

The purpose of the demographic analysis is to identify demographic characteristics of students who are disqualified or do not persist from semester to semester. To determine where the differences are, the demographics were compared to the general student population.

## Part II: Prediction Analysis

The purpose of this study was to determine which factors, if any, can predict student behaviors.

Logistic regression was used to produce a model that can be used to predict which students will be disqualified, or not persist from semester to semester, by comparing certain characteristics of both groups. The analysis determined which factors increase the risk and which will decrease the risk by evaluating the odds ratio and probability of each significant variable (Table 2).

## Part III: Survey Analysis

The purpose of this analysis was to identify the major reasons affecting a student's decision to leave. All disqualified students and a sample of students who did not persist were surveyed via mail for their input with response rates varying from 7.1% to 11.4%.

## Part IV: Course Completion Study

The purpose of this study was to determine which subjects have a higher success rate and which have a higher drop and withdraw rate. The rates were calculated by counting all the grades for each subject and dividing by the total. Success is defined as a grade of A, B, C, or Credit. No Success is defined as a grade of D, F, Incomplete or No Credit.

## **Group 1**

### **Analysis of Students who were Disqualified**



## **Demographic Analysis**

The following differences in demographics were found among students who were disqualified and the general population. All demographics can be found in Appendix A by college and district total.

- At Mesa, fewer females than males were disqualified as compared to the general student population (46.9% and 54.4%). But at Miramar and City, more disqualified students were female than the general population.
- 42.3% of the students who were disqualified at Mesa indicated “transfer after AA” as their educational objective compared to 34.7% of the general student population. Similarly, at Miramar 43.6% of disqualified students stated they intended to transfer compared to 30.5% of the general student population.
- Fewer students with an income of \$33,000 or more were disqualified at Miramar than the population. There were no differences detected at City or Miramar.
- At Miramar, a greater proportion of Filipino students were disqualified than the population (23.9% versus 11.4%). At City, a greater proportion of African American students were disqualified than the population (30.1% versus 16.3%).
- There is a smaller proportion of disqualified students who work 40 or more hours per week than the general student population (18.9% versus 30.4%).
- At Mesa, 20.4% of students who were disqualified had a high school GPA of 2.0 – 2.5 compared to 10.6% of the total Mesa student population. 5.7% of Mesa students who were disqualified had a high school GPA above 3.5 compared to 18.1% of the population.
- There is a greater proportion of students between the ages of 19 and 21 who were disqualified compared to SDCCD population (38.9% versus 22.3%).
- All colleges had more students who were disqualified that earned less than 30 cumulative units. Particularly, 18.0% of Mesa students have earned between 10.5 and 20 units, which is less than the 29.3% of

students who were disqualified who had completed between 10.5 and 20 units.

- Throughout the District, a greater proportion of students who were disqualified had a cumulative GPA less than 2.0 compared to the total student population. At City, 67.2% of students who were disqualified had a cumulative GPA less than 2.0 compared to 34.5% of the population.

### **Prediction Study**

A logistic regression analysis was performed to compare students who were disqualified Fall 2000 (N=1,962) with a random sample of students who were not disqualified during Fall 2000.

The following variables were significant ( $p < .05$ ) in the logistic regression model:

- Math Placement Level
- Age
- Marital status
- Gender
- DSPS
- Ethnicity
- Cumulative GPA
- Income
- Enrollment type

The factors in the model used to predict if students would be disqualified accounts for 39.2% of the total variance. Since this is low, this model must be used with caution. Using this model, 77.1% of the overall predictions were correct. The following table shows the significant variables and the odds ratios for each variable.

### **Key Findings**

- Students who are single, female, or African American have a greater risk of being disqualified.
- Students who received a certificate of high school proficiency have a higher risk of being disqualified.
- Students who are not high school graduates have a greater probability of being disqualified.
- Students who have not taken a math placement test or completed a math class are less likely to be disqualified.
- Students under the age of 20 are less likely to be disqualified.
- Students with an annual income of \$33,000 or more are less likely to be disqualified.

## **Exit Survey Results**

Surveys were sent out to all disqualified students Fall 2000 (N=1,962) and 193 of those students responded (7.1% response rate). Following are some key results from the survey; the full results can be found in Appendix B1.

- When asked what the college could have done to help them succeed, respondents stated that the college could have provided a more flexible course schedule, more financial aid, and a more flexible grading process. Miramar students indicated that more career oriented programs and more study skills classes would have helped. Respondents at Mesa indicated that more counseling services and more career oriented programs would have helped them succeed. City students indicated that more counseling services, more study skills classes, and longer computer lab hours would have helped them not get disqualified.
- The majority of students who were disqualified responded that they spent 1 – 10 hours per week studying outside of class.
- Most students agreed/strongly agreed with the following statements:
  - I felt comfortable in the college environment.
  - I had financial difficulty.
  - I felt safe on campus.
  - Community college is the best way to obtain my educational objective.
  - I am able to do things as well as most other students.
  - I like to work hard in school.
  - I have the ability to complete my educational goal.
- The majority of students disagreed/strongly disagreed with the following statements:
  - I was not interested in school.
  - Going to college is not a priority in my life right now.
- 42.6% of respondents from Mesa agreed or strongly agreed that they could not manage their time well; 47.8% of students at Miramar agreed/strongly agreed; 29.1% of respondents from City agreed/strongly agreed.
- Students from Mesa (63.9%) indicated that parking on campus was an issue more often than Miramar (43.4%), or City (43.6%).
- Of all the respondents, 41% agreed/strongly agreed with the following statement: “Family obligations negatively influenced my studies.”

- 60.9% of students at Miramar felt they did not have good study skills.  
48.9% of all the respondents felt they did not have good study skills.
- 14.4% of students stated that they used tutoring support services, 11.1% used DSPS, and 11.1% used counseling services.

## **Demographic Analysis**

The following differences in demographics were found among students who were enrolled Fall 2000 but did not enroll Spring 2001 and the general population. All demographics can be found in Appendix A by college and district total.

- Of the students who did not persist, a smaller proportion were first time students compared to the SDCCD population (23.5% compared to 32.8%). At City, 46.4% of students who did not persist were first time transfer students compared to 34.1% of the general student population.
- More students with fewer than 10 cumulative units did not persist compared to the student population (56.6% compared to 40.1%).
- There are a greater proportion of students who did not persist that had a cumulative GPA of 0 than the student population (19.5% compared to 12.5%).
- 52.5% of students who did not persist were enrolled in fewer than 5 units Fall 2000 compared to 35.5% of the population.
- At City, there were more students who did not persist with a high school GPA of 3.1 or higher compared to the total City student population (41.5% compared to 32.7% of the population).
- 17.6% of students who did not persist at City were 18 years old, compared to 10.6% of the general student population.
- More students who did not persist at Mesa were working more than 40 hours a week compared to the general student population (30.4% compared to 23.4%).
- 34.1% of ECC students who did not persist were special admits or K-12 students, which is more than the population (15.7%). Similarly, 30.8% of the students who did not persist at ECC were under the age of 17 compared to 13.9% of the general student population.

### **Prediction Study**

A logistic regression analysis was performed to compare a random sample of 5,000 students who did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001 (N = 10,968) with a random sample of 5,000 students who did persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001.

The factors used in the model account for 15.0% of the total variance. Since this is low it is difficult to predict which students will not persist. This implies that a student's decision to persist is not predictive and the results are not included.



## **Exit Survey Results**

Surveys were sent out to a sample of 5,000 students, of which 515 students responded (10.3% response rate). Following are some key findings; the results can be found in Appendix B2.

- The primary reasons students did not persist from Fall 2000 to Spring 2001 were: transferred to another school, conflict with work schedule, and course scheduling problem. At City, personal reasons were also a top reason. At Mesa, completed degree or certificate was a top reason. At Miramar, dissatisfaction with prior instructor was a top reason and completed educational goals.
- The majority of respondents agreed or strongly agreed with the following statements:
  - College staff were helpful.
  - I felt valued as a student.
  - Students were friendly.
  - Faculty were available for help outside of class.
  - I felt comfortable in the college environment.
  - I felt safe on campus.
  - The quality of instruction in most of my classes was good to excellent.
  - Overall, I am satisfied with my experience with the college.
- There were 43.3% of the respondents who disagreed/strongly disagreed with the following statement: It was pretty easy for me to find a parking space on campus most of the time. At Mesa, 52.2% disagreed or strongly disagreed with that statement.
- Of the students who did not persist, 61.7% stated that they plan to return either Summer or Fall 2001.
- Respondents stated that the reason they transferred to another institution was to get their bachelor's degree (45.5%). 4.9% of respondents stated they transferred to another institution because courses were not available.
- The most common transfer institution is San Diego State (45.6%), while 9.6% transferred to UCSD and 7.0% transferred to Grossmont.
- Some of the additional comments were positive comments about SDCCD (25.4%) and positive comments about instructors (10.5%).

# **Course Completion Rates by Subject**

## **Course Completion Rates**

The purpose of this study is to determine which subjects have the highest success rate, unsuccessful rate, drop rate, and withdraw rate during the Fall 2000 semester. Following are some key results; the full report can be found in Appendix C.

- The subjects with the highest success rates at City College were Pipefitting and Jet products. At Mesa, it was Radiologic Technology, Escrow and Animal Health Technology, at Miramar College, it was Aviation Maintenance Technology, and, at ECC, it was Physical Education.
- The subjects with the highest withdrawal rate were Roofing and Aviation. At City, Computer Business Technology and Italian also had high withdrawal rates.
- The highest withdrawal rates at Mesa were Accounting, Chinese and Geography. At Miramar, the subjects with the highest withdrawal rates were Aviation and Work Experience.
- At ECC, the highest unsuccessful rate was in Personal Growth classes. The subjects with the highest unsuccessful rates at City were Arabic and Education, at Mesa and Miramar, Computer Business Tech had the highest percentage of unsuccessful students.

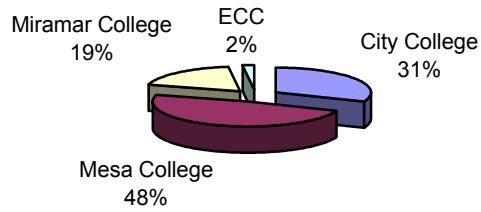

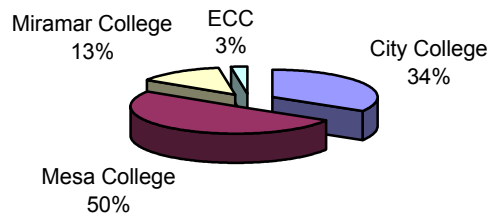

## Analysis of Student Demographics-Fall 2000 SDCCD

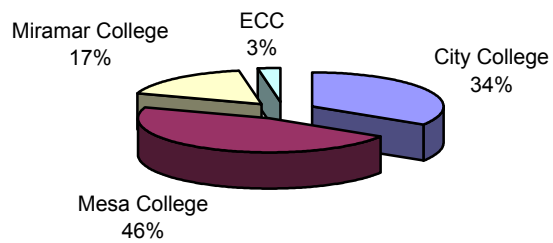
### Total Enrollment by College



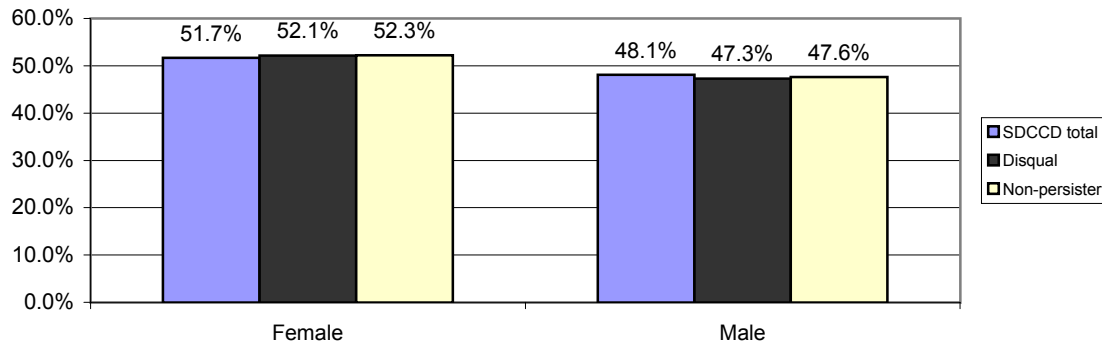
### Disqualified Students by College



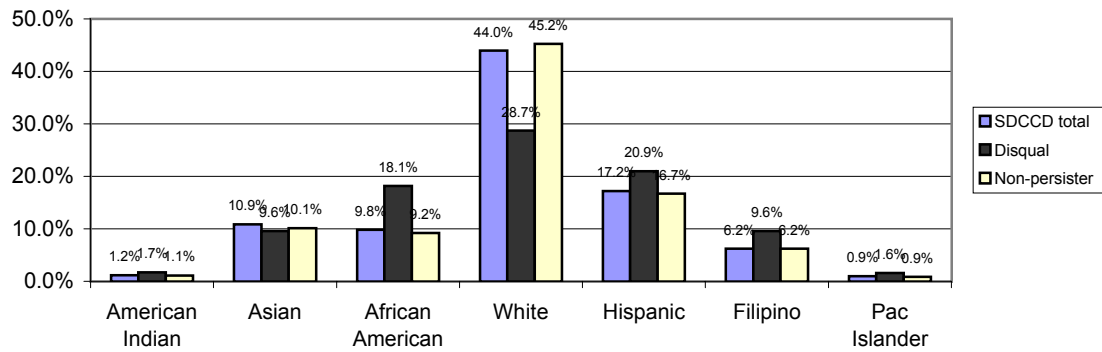
### Non-persistent Students by College



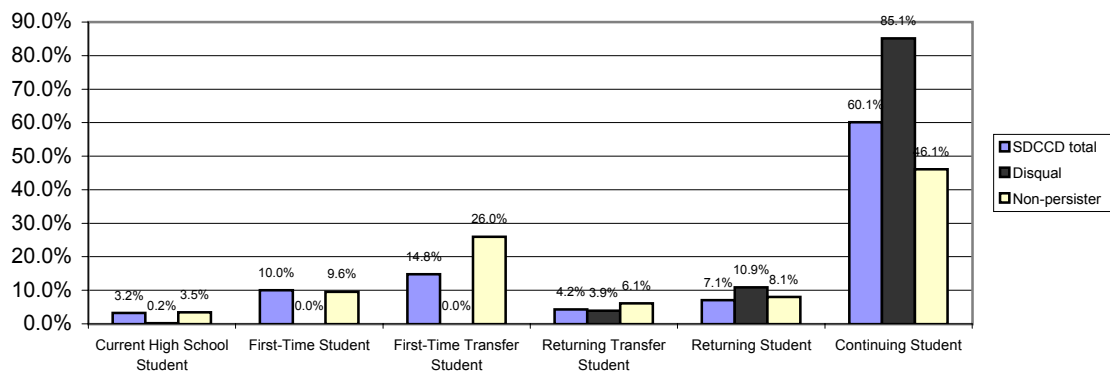

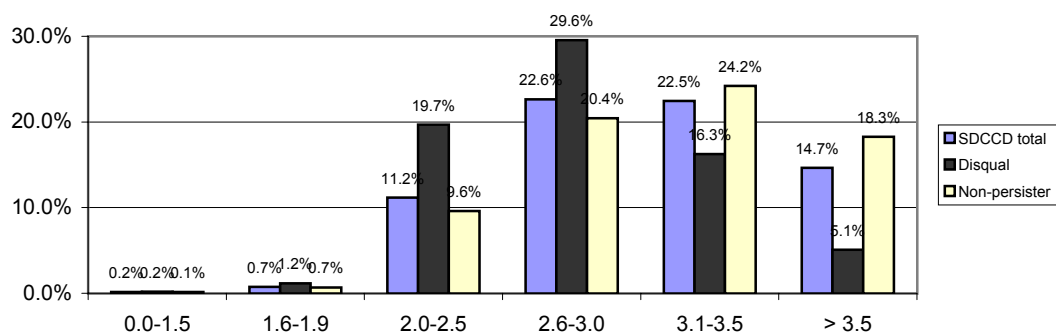

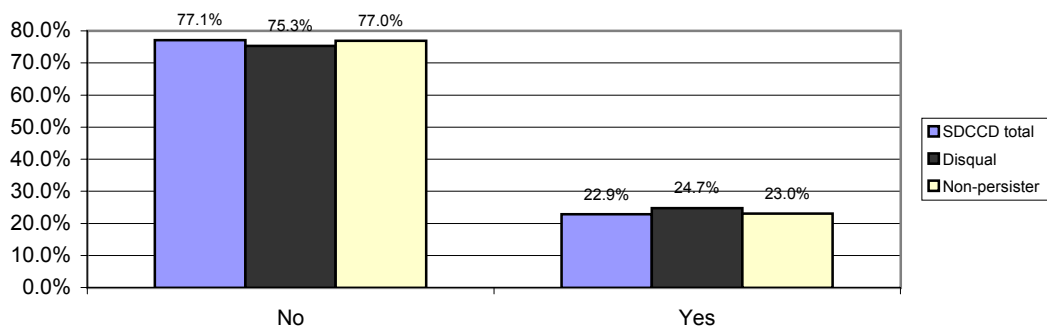
## Employment Hours/Week

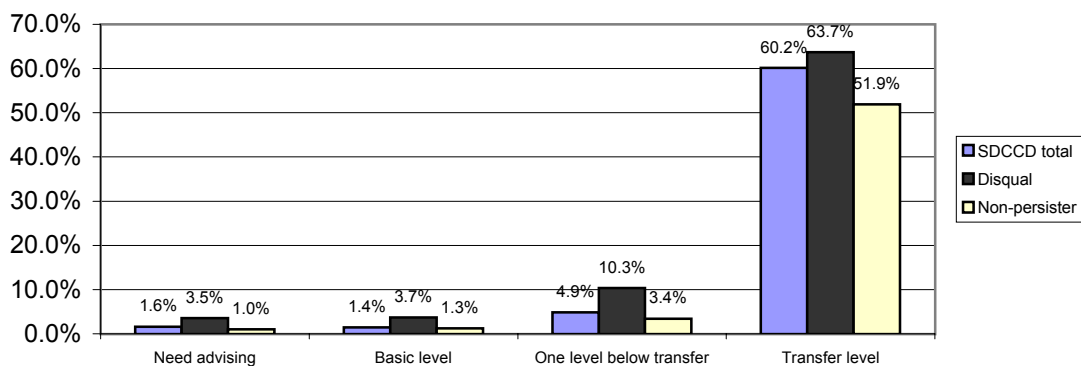

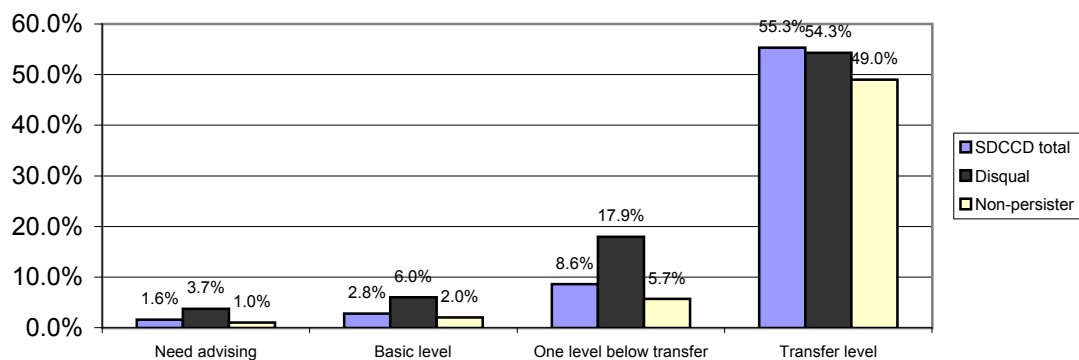

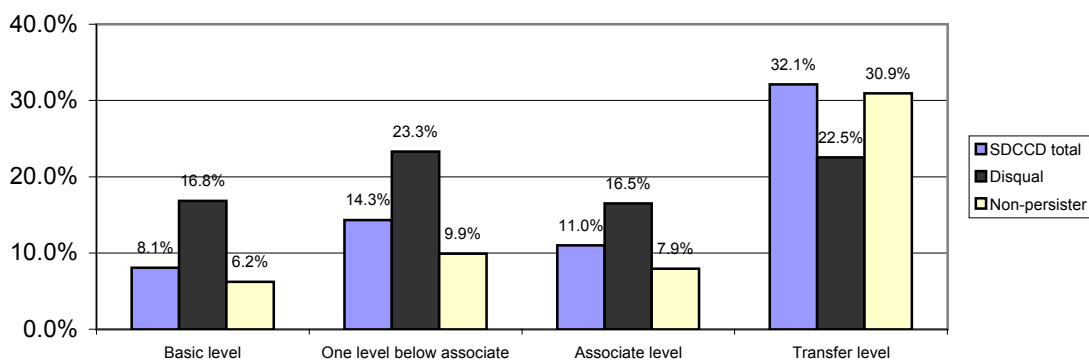
## Reading Skill Level

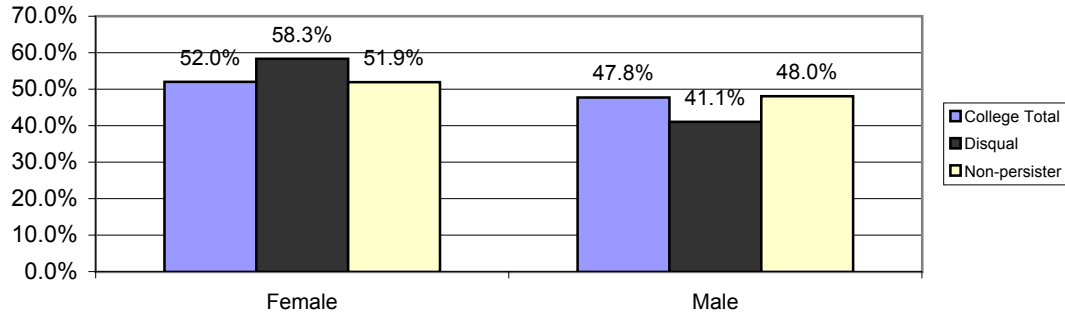

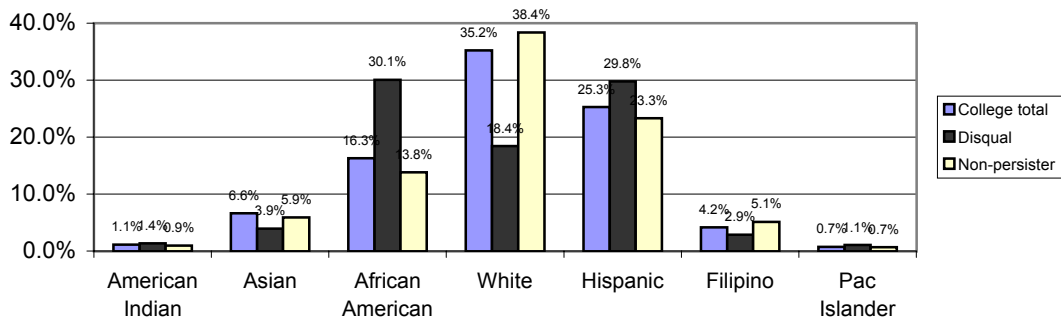

## Analysis of Student Demographics-Fall 2000 City College

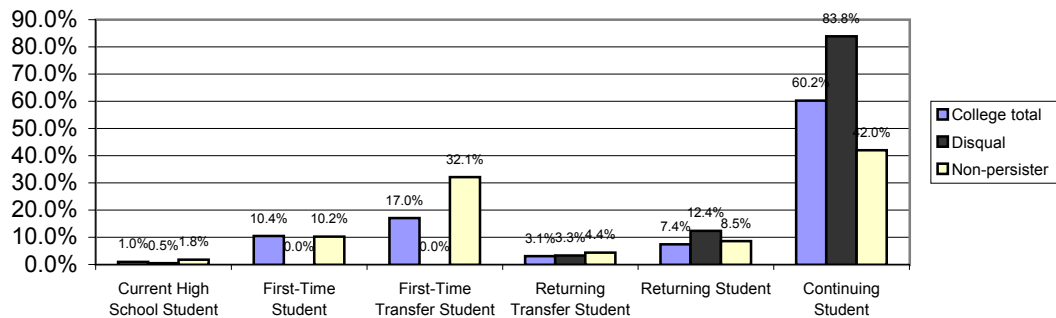
### Gender

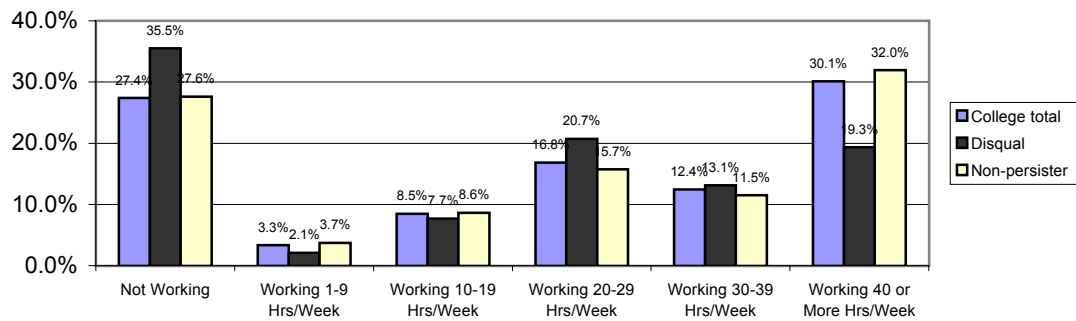

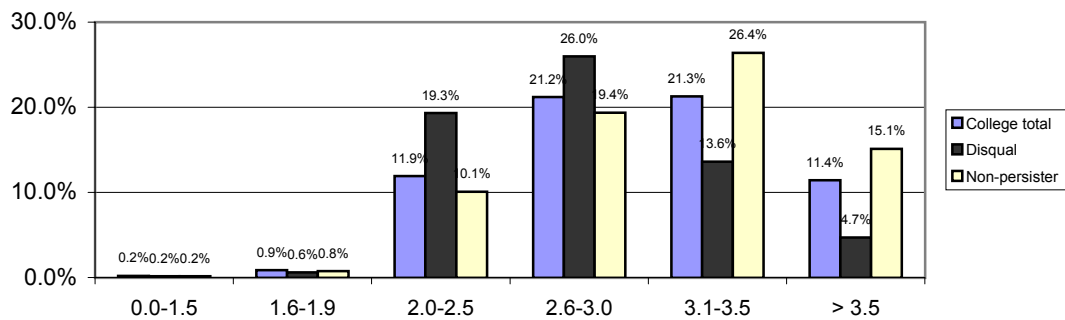

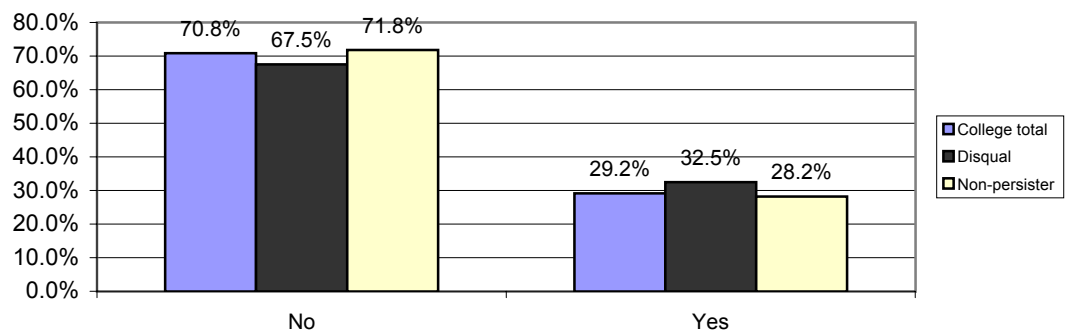
## Employment Hours/Week

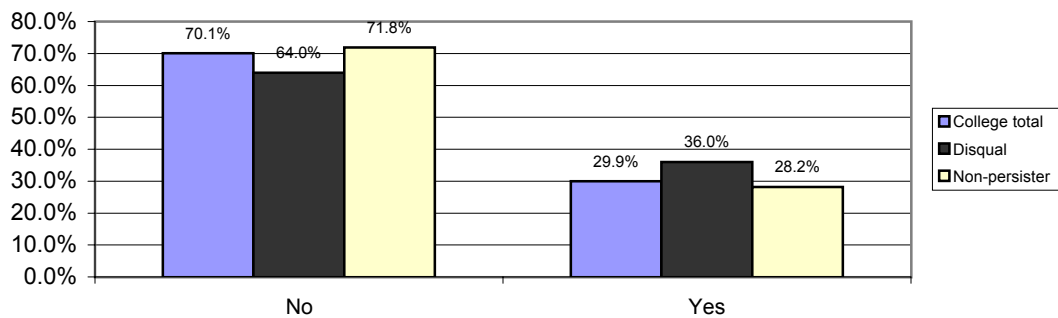
## Employment Hours/Week

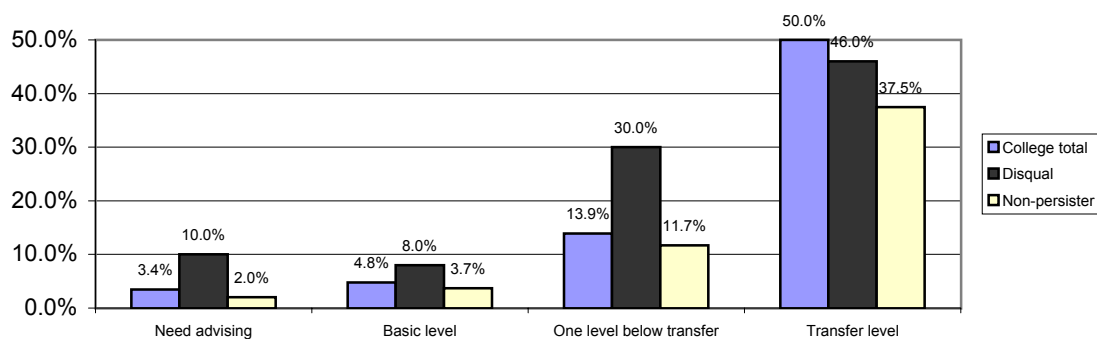

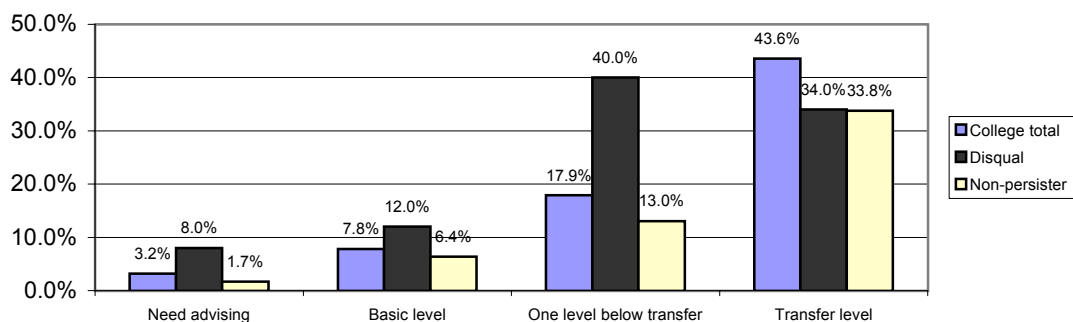

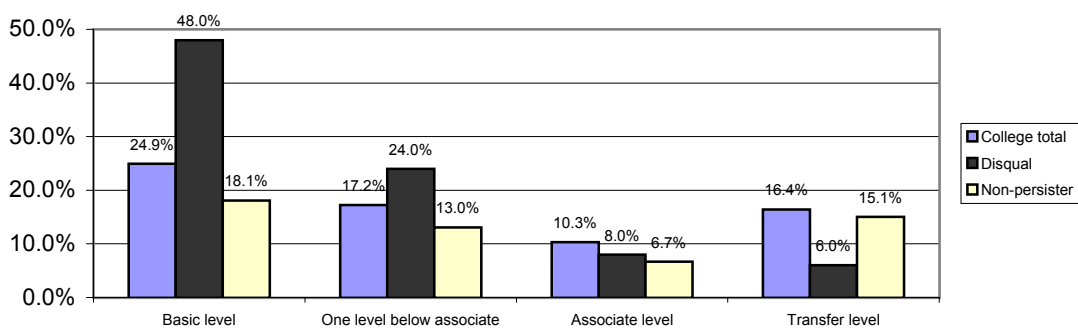
## Reading Skill Level
