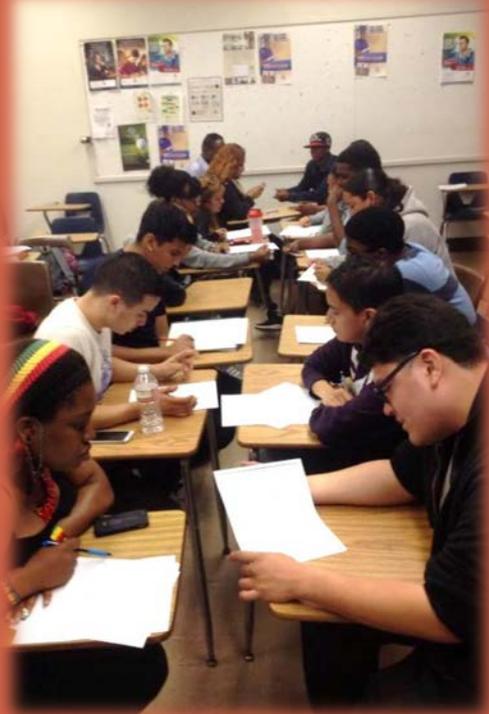

# What is a SDCCD Learning Community?

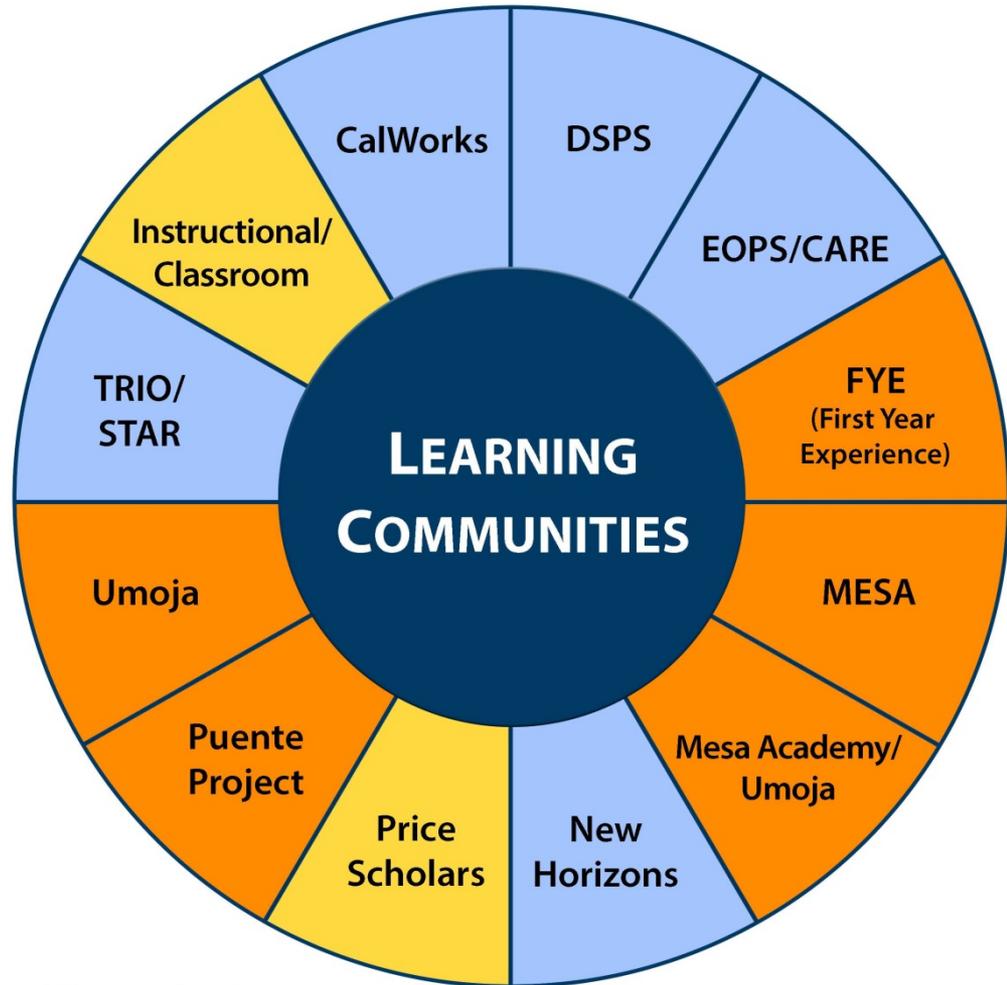


Learning communities are characterized by:

- **Cohort-Based Classes**
  - Class sections with different faculty that share the same students who follow a program plan and are pursuing the same degree/certificate.
  
- **Linked Classes**
  - Two or more class sections that share students, and different faculty work together.
  
- **Student Support Programs**
  - a) A combination of classroom instruction with embedded student support.
  - b) Student success and equity programs designed to motivate and support students from diverse backgrounds.
  
- **Team Taught Classes**
  - Two faculty who develop curriculum toward creating a contextualized learning environment that can include the acquisition of basic skills.
