CAPACITY Sections Offered

As of first census, the total number of sections offered in Fall 2013 was **7%** greater than Fall 2012 (403 more sections overall). The majority of the sections added at the credit colleges were either census week or census day classes, increasing overall capacity by about 6%.

DEMAND Waitlisted Sections

As of opening day in Fall 2013, approximately 60% of all sections at the credit colleges had waitlists (2,815 sections) compared to 69% in Fall 2012 (2,920 sections). Fewer waitlisted sections is one indication of improving the colleges' capacity to better meet the demand.

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DEMAND Waitlisted Seats

The number of waitlisted seats at the colleges decreased by 2% from *last fall (24,453) to this* fall (20,585). The 7% increase in sections offered, along with the minimal increase in enrollment has likely contributed to fewer waitlisted seats.

PRODUCTIVITY Enrollment

As of first census for Fall 2013, enrollments at the credit colleges varied by college, but **overall were** unchanged compared to Fall 2012. Continuing **Education** was significantly higher due to students being able to register sooner than in Fall 2012, as well as the ability

to register online.

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PRODUCTIVITY Fill Rates

As of first census, for Fall 2013 fill rates were lower at each college and overall compared to the same point in time last year. This is partly a result of the increased capacity from added sections, coupled with relatively soft enrollments.

OUTLOOK Enrollment Targets

The District is projected to be approximately **1.5**% over target (620 FTES) in 2013/14. Due to the previous large reductions of summer classes, the largest planned increase is for Summer 2014 with approximately 50% more summer offerings.
