Programs

- Joint Diploma Program
- Accelerated College Program
- Kearny Fast Track Program
- Student Success Programs
- Middle College High School/Early College High School Program



Joint Diploma Program



- Provides adult students (18 years to 19 years 11 months) and secondary students (at least 16 years of age who are enrolled in San Diego Unified School District) the opportunity to complete course requirements to earn an Adult Education Joint High School Diploma
- Over 2,000 Joint Diplomas have been awarded to students since 2005-2006





Accelerated College Program



- Founded in 1963
- Advanced placement classes taught by community college faculty at the high schools
 - Calculus
 - Political Science
- Students earn up to 15 units of college credit while in high school
- Currently in place at 15 high schools
- 800 students enrolled annually
- Students earn college credit and clear high school graduation requirements simultaneously



Kearny Fast Track Program



- Established in 2003
- Provides an opportunity for juniors and seniors at Kearny High School to enroll in advanced scholastic and technical courses at Mesa College
- To participate eligible juniors must have a 3.5 GPA and eligible seniors a 3.0 GPA
- Students can complete up to 24 units of college credit upon graduation from high school
- Over 1,000 students have participated in this program



Student Success Programs



- There are many collaborative programs designed to foster college readiness and student academic success
 - Summer Readiness Program
 - Teacher Education Program
 - Gear-Up Program
 - Transportation Technology Program





Summer Readiness Program



- Designed to give incoming freshmen who qualify for EOPS an early orientation and hands-on experience to prepare for college
- About 70 incoming freshmen participate in an eight-week orientation each year
- Participants take classes in reading, writing and personal growth
- Intensive supplemental instruction & support services are also provided



Teacher Education Program



- Goal is for community college students to explore the field of education as a career
- Participants provide tutoring in local elementary schools to gain practical experience working with K-12 students





Gear-Up Program



- Goal is to increase college going rates and raise student expectations
- Program provides academic and career information as well as support to participants
- Students also participate in scheduled college activities on the college campus

- Goal is to begin to prepare students for career options in transportation technology






Middle College High School/ Early Middle College Program

- Designed to enhance academic success






Middle College High School/ Early Middle College Program



Goals

- Reduce high school drop-out rate
- Improve academic skills, self-concept, self-esteem and decision-making skills of participants
- Provide reduced class size
- Provide curriculum and support services that are responsive to student needs






San Diego Metropolitan Regional Career and Technical High School (MET)



- Co-located on Mesa College campus
- Serves about 150 students, grades 9-12
- Intensive college preparation curriculum including an internship requirement
- Impressive graduation, retention and transfer rates






Health Sciences High and Middle College



- The program serves hundreds of students each semester in grades 9-12 to prepare them to matriculate to Mesa College in the Medical Assisting field
- Students begin the program in high school and have the opportunity to finish their program at Mesa college





City Middle College at Garfield



- Partnership between San Diego City College and Garfield Continuation High School
- Established in 2000
- Enrolls about 100 at-risk students each year
- Program has served over 1,000 students since inception
- Students take both high school and college courses to enhance academic success





Early Middle College at City College



- Established in 2008
- Housed on City College campus
- Students enroll in both high school and college classes
- Serves about 150 underrepresented, disadvantaged students annually
- Strong academic outcomes





San Diego Performing Arts Early College High School



- Established in 2008
- Combined high school and college level courses focusing on the performing arts
- Goal is to improve students' reading, writing and mathematics skills
- Targeted for 10th graders
- Includes course on college readiness





San Diego Lead, Explore, Achieve, Discover, and Serve (LEADS) Early College High School



- Established in 2008
- Partnership between San Diego City College and San Diego High School Complex
- Integrates high school and college courses focusing on post-secondary education, leadership and the workforce
- Targeted for 10th graders
- Includes course on college readiness
