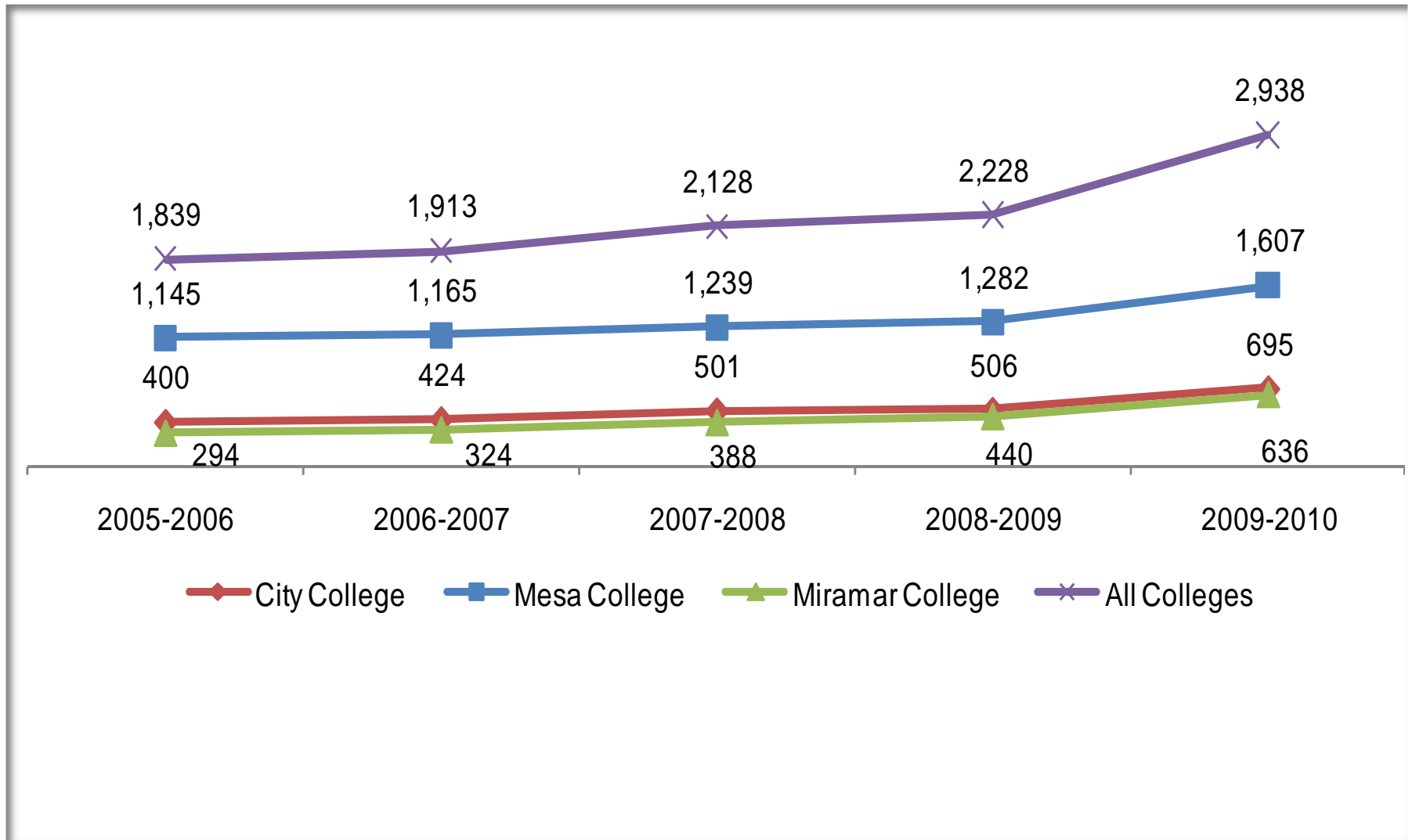

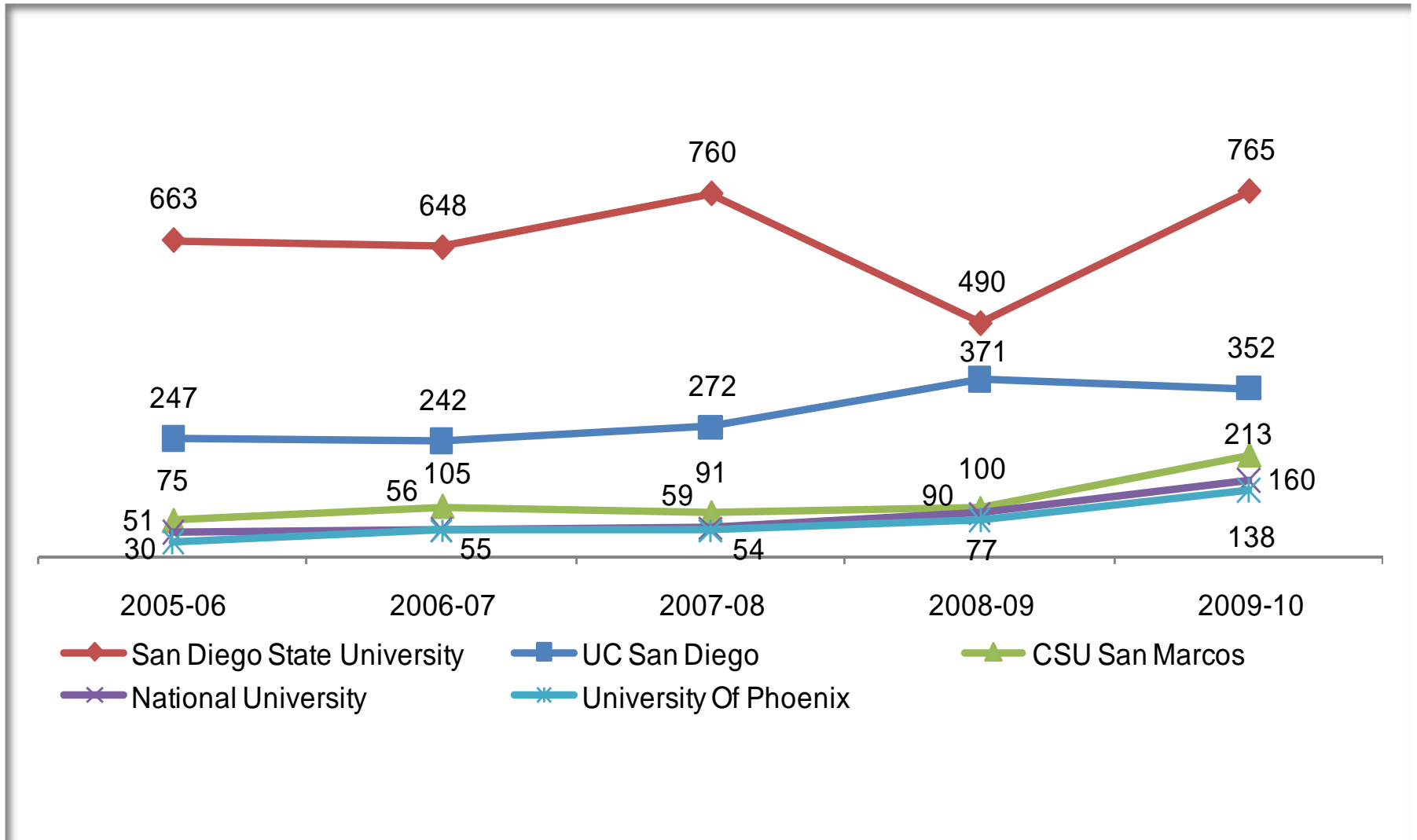
# Transfer Volume 2005/06 – 2009/10



# Transfer Volume by Demographics

- Overall, there was a 60% increase in transfer volume between 2005/06 and 2009/10. All ethnic groups showed increases in transfer volume:
  - African American: 103%
  - American Indian: 33%
  - Asian/Pacific Islander: 85% increase
  - Filipino: 49% increase
  - Latino 120% increase
  - White: 43% increase
- Females had 66% increase compared to 53% increase for males

# Transfer Destination Trends

- While the highest number of students consistently transfer to SDSU, there has only been a 15% increase since 2005/06.
- Increases to other institutions:
  - UCSD 43%
  - CSU San Marcos 184%
  - National University 214%
  - University of Phoenix 360%
- There are slight variations among the colleges for the top 5 transfer destinations
  - City: UC Berkeley instead of CSU San Marcos
  - Mesa: UC Berkeley instead of University of Phoenix

# Transfer Destination by Ethnicity

- SDSU is the top transfer destination across all ethnic groups.
- UCSD is the second highest transfer destination for Asian, Filipino, Latino and White students, and fourth highest for African American students.
- University of Phoenix is the second highest transfer destination for African American students and third highest destination for Latino students.

# Transfer Rates

- Three cohorts of students who demonstrated transfer seeking behaviors were tracked over six years for transfer:
  1. 2002/03 cohort tracked to 2007/08: **40% (n=2,217)**
  2. 2003/04 cohort tracked to 2008/09: **38% (n=1,782)**
  3. 2004/05 cohort tracked to 2009/10: **42% (n=2,171)**

*External Benchmark: Average statewide transfer rate is 40%*



# Transfer Rates by Ethnicity

## Average transfer rates for three cohorts

	<b>SDCCD Students</b>	<b>Statewide Benchmarks</b>
African America	31%	33%
American Indian	31%	31%
Asian/Pacific Islander	49%	55%
Filipino	48%	38%
Latino	31%	31%
White	42%	43%

# Transfer-Prepared Rates

- Three cohorts of students who completed 60 UC/CSU transferrable units, but did not transfer, were tracked over six years to determine potential transfer rate, if added to actual transfer rate:
  1. 2002/03 cohort tracked to 2007/08: **46% (n=306)**
  2. 2003/04 cohort tracked to 2008/09: **43% (n=255)**
  3. 2004/05 cohort tracked to 2009/10: **49% (342)**

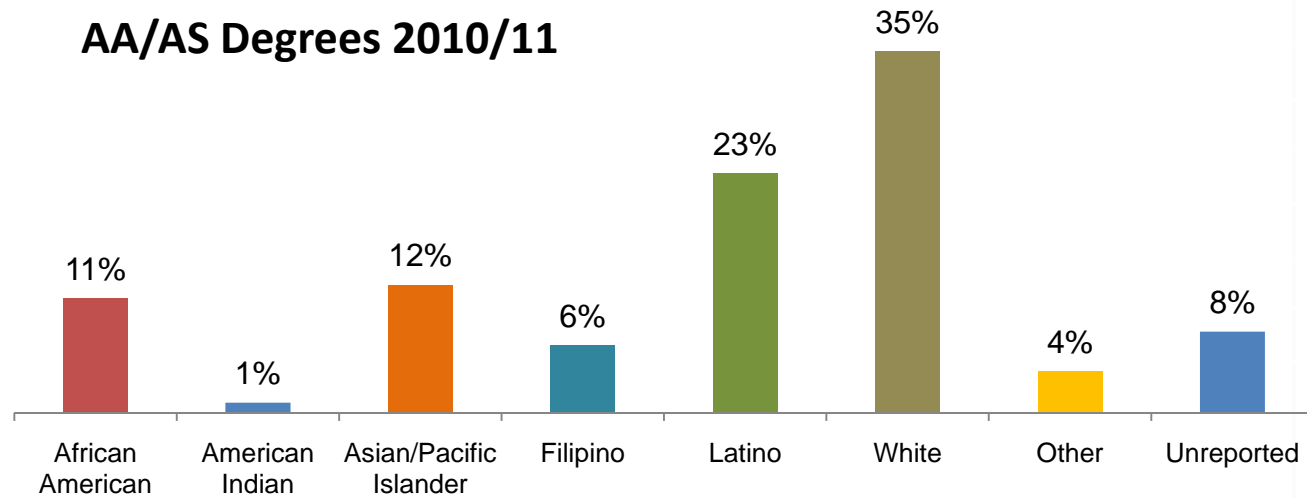

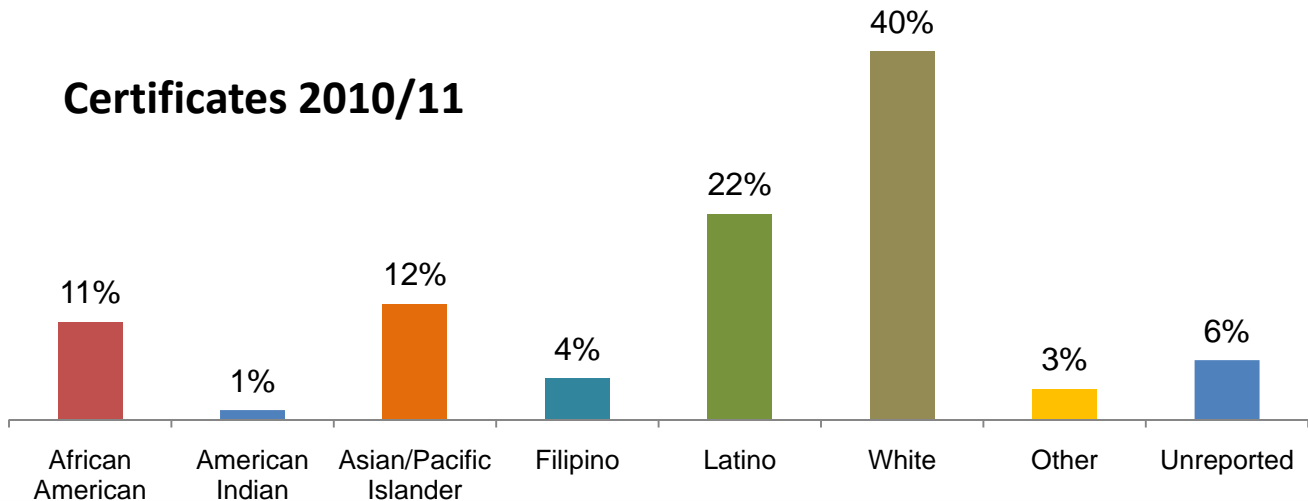
