Fees and Tuition Information Fall 2018

Community College Enrollment Fee:

The enrollment fee is assessed of all students, including nonresidents. The current enrollment fee for Fall 2018 is \$46.00 per unit.

Waiver of the enrollment fee (CCPG) is available to students who petition and qualify as recipients of benefits under the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program, the Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary (SSI) program, or the General Assistance program.

- Indentured apprentices are exempt from enrollment fees for Apprenticeship Program classes only.
- Financial Aid may be available to students who qualify for assistance.
- Certain exemptions apply to “special part-time high school students.” Contact the Admissions Office for more information.

Health Services Fee:

All students are assessed a mandatory fee for health services and accident insurance. The health services fee for Fall is currently \$20.00.

The following students are exempt from the health services fee:

- Students attending under an approved apprenticeship program.
- Students who, at the time of enrollment qualify for a CCPG-A under Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program (TANF), the Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Program (SSI/SSP), and General Assistance program.
- Students who depend exclusively on prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination, or organization. These students may petition to have the fee waived.

Nonresident Tuition:

- In addition to the enrollment fee and health fee, tuition is charged to students who are not legal residents of California for tuition purposes. The nonresident tuition fee is \$245.00 per unit.

Baccalaureate Degree Program Fee:

- A baccalaureate degree program fee shall be charged for all upper division coursework of \$84.00 per unit. This charge shall be assessed in addition to the current enrollment fee of \$46.00 per unit, and the nonresident tuition of \$245.00 per unit.

Additional Fees:

Current Fees –

- o Carpool – (per semester) \$30.00
- o Motorcycles and scooters (per semester) \$17.50
- o Transcript of Record \$ 5.00
(After two have been issued free of charge)
- o Loss or damage of equipment and books Cost
- o A.S. College Membership \$8.00 per academic year for Fall and Spring (not available in the Summer)

- o Credit by Examination \$46.00/unit (subject to change)
- o Student Representation Fee \$ 1.00

Note: Student receiving public assistance or who are determined eligible for financial aid based on income standards may purchase a single car permit for \$25.00. (Contact the Financial Aid Office on campus for eligibility determination).

All fees are subject to change.

Students are expected to buy all books and supplies needed for their courses. Certain occupational programs may require additional expenditures for tools, uniforms and/or liability insurance.

Student Representation Fee: All students are required to pay a \$1.00 student representation fee. This fee is expended by the college solely for the purpose of student advocacy efforts to Federal, State and Local governments. Students have the right to refuse to pay the fee for religious, moral, political or financial reasons.
