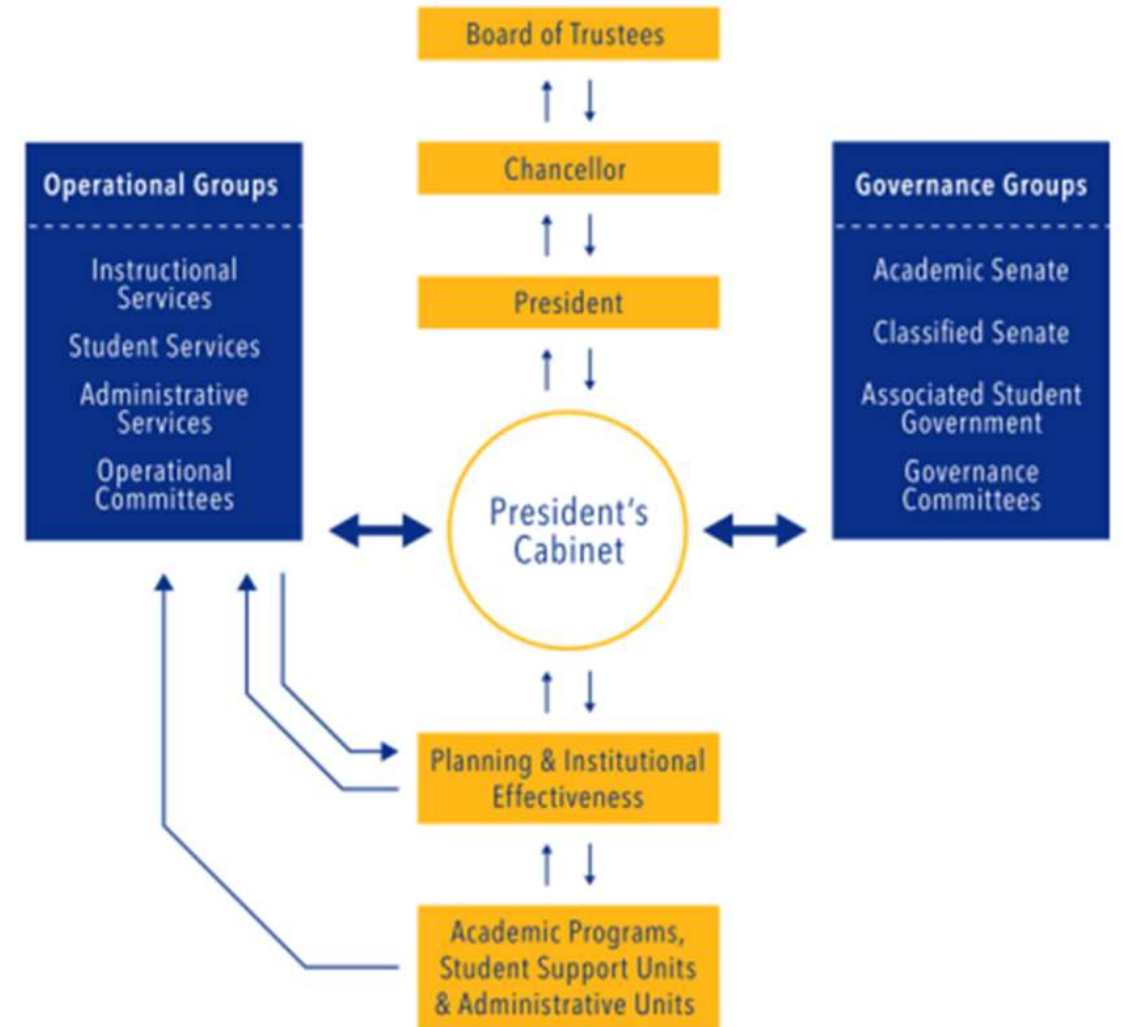

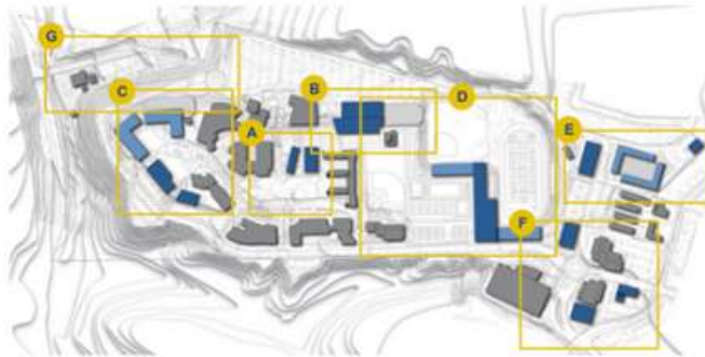

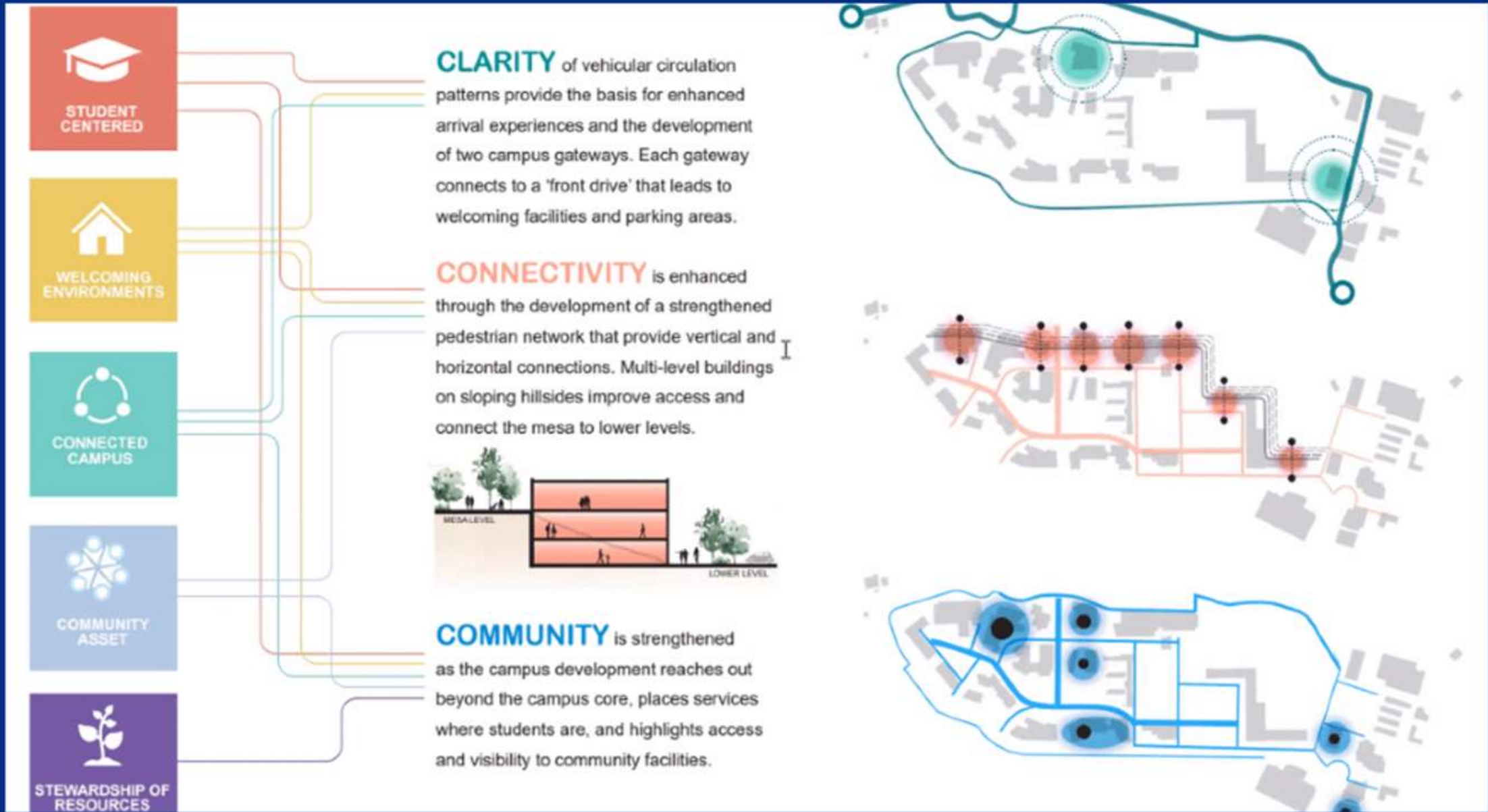
THE CHARGE

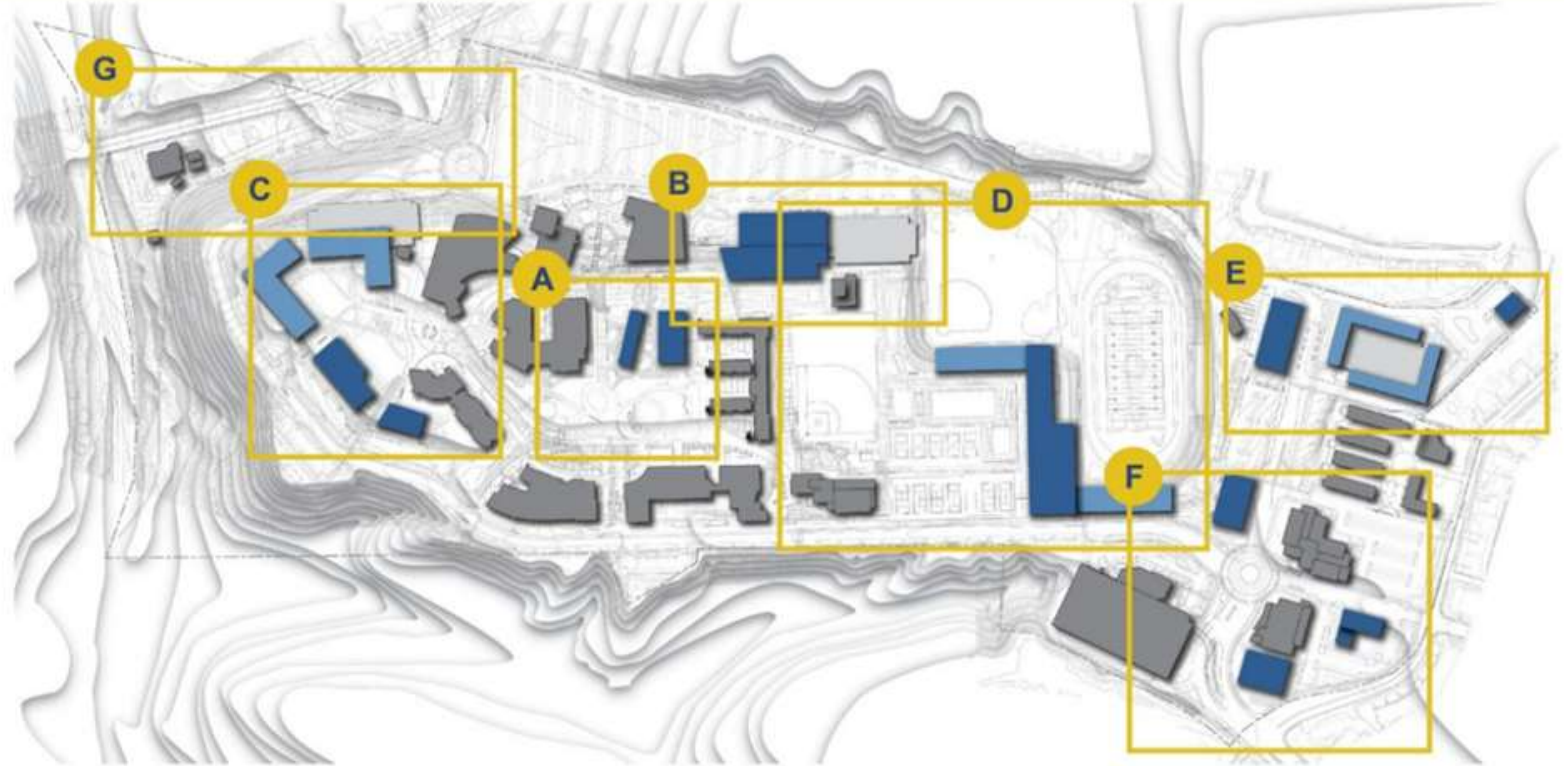

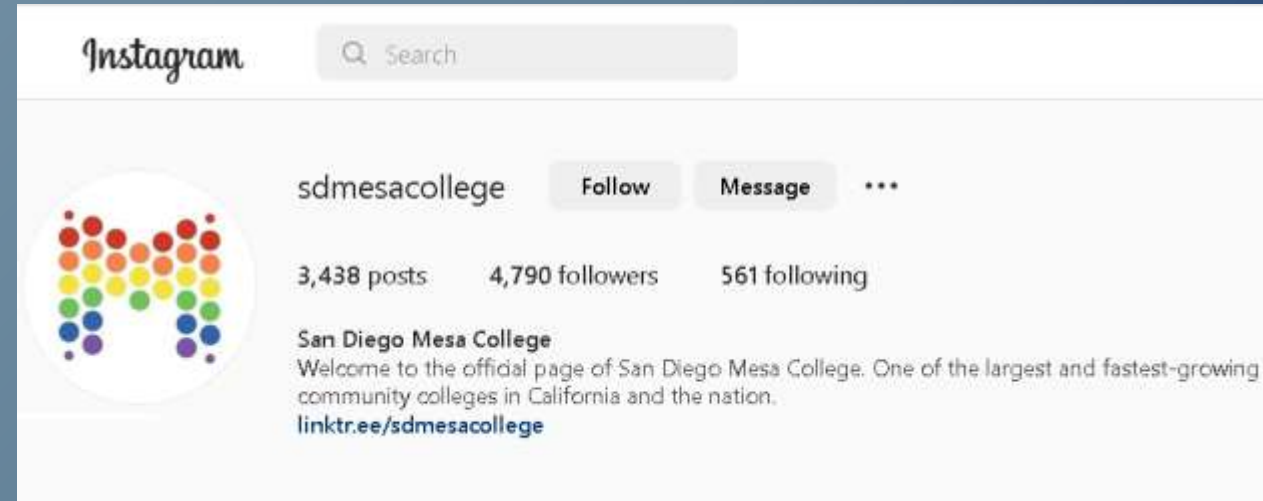
