



## Noncredit Instruction Title 5 Changes

During the July meeting, the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges approved revisions to title 5, regulations §55150—Approval of Noncredit Courses and Programs, §55151—Career Development and College Preparation, §55154—Adult High School Diploma Programs, §55155—Non-Credit Certificates, and §58160—Non-Credit Course Funding. The proposed changes equalize noncredit curriculum approval processes to that of credit curriculum approval processes in order to be more responsive to the curricular needs of the students in the California Community College system. The Preparing Accomplished Transfers to the Humanities (PATH) Program Activity Manager and Program Assistant conducted outreach at two Mesa Summer Cruise events on Wednesday, July 10, 2019 and on Wednesday, July 17, 2019, reaching roughly 140 students. The Mesa Summer Cruise exposes incoming students to resources available on campus. The students were informed about the opportunities offered by the PATH program and information regarding the application process. The Program Assistant visited San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar colleges during the weeks of July 24 and 29 in order to identify and confirm attendance at upcoming orientation and welcome-back events. # Child Development Training Consortium

Annually, San Diego City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges participate in the Child Development Training Consortium's (CDTC) educational support stipend program for students studying and working in the Child Development field.

Funding is provided by the California Department of Education Early Education and Support Division through the Yosemite Community College District. A total of \$12,500 was awarded to the District.

CDTC Funding supports student completion of college coursework, Certificates of Achievement, and Associate in Science Degrees, as well as pursuit of Child Development permits at multiple levels, from Assistant Teacher to Program Director, which are required for advancement in the field. Eligible students must be working within the childcare profession and attending college at the same time. Students may apply for funds to cover the cost of permit applications, tuition, books, and supplies.

For the 2018-2019 program year, fifty students received funds ranging from \$55 to \$600. Of the fifty students who received funding, 15 were from San Diego City College, 14 from San Diego Mesa College, and 21 from San Diego Miramar College.

Fall 2019 outreach efforts begin in early September. We encourage Child Development Faculty and Staff to share CDTC program information and encourage students to apply. Those who received funding in the past may continue to apply each semester they are both employed and enrolled in classes.

The Districtwide Faculty Coordinator is available to visit classrooms, present CDTC program information, and support student applications for funding.

## §55206. Separate Course Approval

Previously, regular and effective contact was mandated between instructors and students. The change in title 5 now requires student-to-student contact to be included in the Official Course Outline of Record (COR).

Faculty must ensure that assignments and activities in the online portion of their class include student-to-student contact. The SDCCD Online Learning Pathways Faculty Certification Program helps instructors design their courses to meet all title 5 regulations.
