Summary of Title 5 Changes to Repeatability for Repeatable Courses

- Permits unlimited repetition of a course as a result of a significant change in industry or licensure standards such that the course is needed for employment or licensure requirements.
 - Repetition on student basis
 - Documentation required
- 2) Removed provision to designate a technology course as repeatable when content changed ("Repeat refresh").
- 3) Physical Education courses are no longer repeatable (except Intercollegiate Athletics).
- 4) Continues "family" limitation (courses related in content) to 4 "takes" for activity courses (now referred to "active participatory courses"):
 - Physical education
 - Visual arts
 - Performing arts
- 5) FTES for intercollegiate athletics (and related courses) now limited to 350 hours/year/sport (Summer/Fall/Spring).
 - 175 hours for conditioning and skills building
 - 175 hours for courses dedicated to the sport
- 6) Intercollegiate athletics courses may be repeated an unlimited number of times, however there are limitations on total hours that can be claimed for apportionment per sport/year.
- 7) Designates intercollegiate academic or vocational competition courses as repeatable (i.e. Forensics, SIFE, Robotics). Repetitions on these courses are limited to 4 "takes" per course, or in courses related in content (families).
 - Must be sanctioned activity
- 8) Significant lapse of time for course or required prerequisite defined as <u>at least</u> 36 months unless required by UC or CSU to be taken sooner.
 - Repetition of student
 - Documentation required
- Permits designating a course as repeatable if UC or CSU requires repetition as part of a major.
 - Documentation required (maintained in CurricUNET)
